

Rodeo entertains, benefits others

The annual Y's Men's Rodeo is not only a circuit finals rodeo, bringing the best of the best to Minot for competition and prize money, the event also raises money for the YMCA's Triangle Y youth camp located near Garrison, N.D. And it offers Air Force Global Strike Command airmen opportunity for entertainment and giving back to the local community.

This year's 56th annual event raised money for improvements and scholarships while entertaining crowds with what's been dubbed America's original sport. The event also raises money for breast cancer research through the Tough Enough to Wear Pink campaign's sale of pink t-shirts.

"Rodeo was born in the ranching industry," said Ruth Nicolaus, Y's Men's Rodeo spokesperson. "It gets in your blood."

Ms. Nicolaus said the great thing about the Y's Men's Rodeo is it's entertaining and for a good cause.

"This rodeo is a two-fold event," she said. "It gives back to the community, and its true sport and great entertainment."

The annual rodeo, sanctioned by the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association, draws top rate competitors in seven standard events taking place over the course of four days. "It's affordable family fun," said Ms. Nicolaus. "It's two and a half hours of comedy and competition."

Throughout the evening, events such as saddle bronc riding, steer wrestling and bull riding lend themselves to the fast-paced entertainment rodeo-goers enjoy.

"It's a lot of horsepower," said Ms. Nicolaus.

Jason Behm, the 2010 Y's Men's Rodeo chairman said the thing he most enjoys about the rodeo is that 100 percent of the proceeds go to the Triangle Y camp.

"It's a great rodeo, and it's nice to donate the money to the kids," said Mr. Behm.

Mr. Behm said the fact that it's a circuit finals rodeo

draws the best contestants competing for prize money and the right to go to the finals, as well as volunteers who come together to put on "one heck of a show."

"It's very exciting," he said.

Dan Cleas, also known as Bullseye Bob, is one of those volunteers. Now a professional clown, he is a 2001 retiree from the 5th Medical Group. He has been supporting the Y's Men's Rodeo as a way to give back to the community.

"It gets in your blood," said Mr. Cleas. "I enjoy working with kids."

Mr. Cleas supports the Wild West Rodeo, an event held for special needs children on opening night of the rodeo.

"They deserve to have fun," he said.

Pat Travnicek, chief of arms control at Minot AFB and the rodeo committee's base liaison, ensures base members know they are in-

vited to attend the rodeo and publicizes military appreciation day, which provides discount admission for military members, retirees and their families.

"The committee is a great group of people working for a worthy cause," said Mr. Travnicek.

Mr. Travnicek, in his second season with the committee, said he became interested in working with the committee because it benefits

kids in the area.

At the end of the rodeo weekend, the region's acclaimed best departed Minot guaranteed a spot in the National Finals Rodeo in March held at Oklahoma City. And after four days of thrills and spills, the Y's Men's Rodeo raised more than \$600,000 for improvements and scholarships for the Triangle Y Camp.

"It's all for the kids," Mr. Travnicek said.

Cooking spray

Fruit

3 tablespoons butter
 1/2 cup light brown sugar
 5 to 6 apples (such as Golden Delicious),
 pared, cored, and cut into 8 wedges each
 2 tablespoons maple syrup

Cheese Biscuit Crust

3/4 cup all-purpose flour,
 plus additional for rolling
 1/3 cup stoneground yellow cornmeal
 1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 3 tablespoons cold butter, cut into small pieces
 1/2 cup freshly grated Parmesan cheese
 3/4 cup shredded extra-sharp Cheddar cheese
 1/2 cup buttermilk or plain yogurt
 Ice water

1. Preheat oven to 425F. Coat a 9- or 10-inch cast-iron skillet with cooking spray, and place over medium heat. Add butter; swirl pan to coat bottom evenly. Add sugar, and cook over medium heat, shaking occasionally, until sugar starts to melt.
2. Add apples, placing prettiest wedges in first, curved side down, in concentric circles. Then top with several more layers of apple wedges (they don't have to be orderly). Cover, lower heat slightly, and steam about 6 to 8 minutes, occasionally shaking pan gently, lifting lid, and spooning cooking liquid over apples, then recovering. Remove lid, turn off heat, and drizzle maple syrup over apples. Set aside.
3. Combine flour, cornmeal, baking powder, baking soda and salt in a food processor. Pulse a few times to combine. Add butter and cheeses, and pulse several times until mealy, with distinct but small pieces of butter and cheese. Add buttermilk; pulse. Add 2 or 3 tablespoons ice water, 1 tablespoon at a time, and pulse until dough begins to come together.
4. Turn out onto a floured board; press or roll into a circle the size of the skillet. It will be thicker than a pastry crust but much thinner than a conventional biscuit. Don't worry about tears.
5. Place dough on top of apples, tucking any extra in at the sides. Bake 25 to 30 minutes or until top crust is very golden and a bit crisp.
6. Let stand about 5 minutes; then turn out onto a large platter, replacing any apples that may have stuck to the bottom of the skillet. Serve warm. Serves 8.

AF Security Forces Museum exhibit honors fallen Airmen

(AFNS) - There was no hesitation for the mother of a fallen security forces Airman when the invitation was extended three months ago.

"I'm going, she thought about the memorial run/walk and opening of a new exhibit at the Air Force Security Forces Museum Sept. 28 here. The events honored the eight security forces Airmen killed in conflict since 2005.

"It was important to me because (Lackland Air Force Base) was a part of the beginning," said Jackie Chavis. "I came to (my son's basic military training) graduation, he did his time, and then he was gone.

"I knew I had to be here. It was in my heart that I couldn't miss this," she said.

Mrs. Chavis' 21-year-old son, Airman 1st Class

LeeBernard Chavis, from the 824th Security Forces Squadron, was killed Oct. 14, 2006, while on duty as a turret gunner with Iraqi police in Baghdad.

In a show of support, more than 1,100 security forces Airmen from Lackland and Randolph Air Force bases lined the street in front of the museum as Brig. Gen. Jimmy McMillian addressed the families before the ribbon cutting ceremony.

"We, the defenders that surround you, are grateful and humbled by your presence here," said General McMillian, director of security forces and the deputy chief for Air Force Logistics, Installations and Mission Support.

As the sun rose on the morning of the opening, Airmen and family members participated in a memorial 5K run and mile walk. It offered the opportunity to reflect on the possibility of retracing a loved one's footsteps.

Upper Souris National Wildlife Refuge celebrates 75 years of conservation!

Come celebrate 75 years of conservation and tickle your sense of wonder as you experience the great fall migration, wide open spaces, abundance of wildlife and serene landscapes at Upper Souris National Wildlife Refuge.

Upper Souris Refuge belongs to a nationwide network of federal lands – the National Wildlife Refuge System – dedicated to the protection of wildlife habitat and wildlife species. The nation's 552 national wildlife refuges and 37 Wetland Management Districts not only protect the nation's natural resources, but also offer a range of wildlife-dependent recreation.

On August 27, 1935, President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed the executive designat-

ing Upper Souris as a refuge and breeding ground for migratory birds and other wildlife.

Refuge staff decided it would be best to celebrate the refuge's 75th birthday during the refuge system's week long celebration during National Wildlife Refuge week October 10 through the 16. Here's what is planned to help you celebrate Upper Souris Refuge's 75th Birthday on October 16 and National Wildlife Refuge Week with us:



2010 Air Force Climate Survey under way

RANDOLPH AIR FORCE BASE, Texas (AFNS) - Total force Airmen and Department of Defense civilians have an opportunity to voice their concerns to Air Force leaders during the 2010 Air Force Climate Survey.

The purpose of the survey is to assess the opinions and perceptions of Air Force active-duty, Guard, Reserve and civilian personnel on a wide range of issues, including overall job satisfaction, resources and unit performance.

"Maximum input is very crucial in providing valuable feedback to Air Force leaders so they may create positive

changes in units," said Col. Brian Norman, the Air Force Manpower Agency commander. "Survey answers directly impact leaders' decisions on issues that affect the total force."

The results of the last survey conducted in the fall of 2008 revealed that more than 90 percent of the nearly 250,000 respondents indicated they were happy with their Air Force jobs and the performance of their organizations. They also indicated they generally had trust in their unit's leadership.

Major concerns revealed by the 2008 survey showed that the strain on manpower and time was an issue for many employees. The majority of home-station Airmen reported an increase in levels

of stress, workload and hours due to deployments.

AFMA officials said the average time to complete this year's survey is around 25 minutes, and respondents may save their progress and return at a later time.

As with past surveys, unit leaders will have access to their respective results for

improving their organization and their organization's ability to accomplish the mission. However, AFMA officials stress that maximum participation is the only way the Air Force Climate Survey can produce meaningful results.

"It's imperative for our Airmen and DOD civilians to speak today in order to shape

tomorrow," Colonel Norman said.

Officials began sending individual e-mail invitations Oct. 8 for the confidential survey that will be conducted in stages.

Father returns from deployment, meets daughter

AVIANO AIR BASE, Italy (AFNS) - He was anxious; excited actually. He gazed at the crowd across the tarmac looking for someone familiar, his wife, and someone he had never met, his baby girl. He had seen the baby only through photos and webcam.

Then, he found them. He looked at his now four-month-old baby for the first time in person, and she smiled at him.

"Seeing her for the first time, I don't know how to describe it," said 1st Lt. William Whiddon, the 510th Fighter Squadron intelligence officer in charge. "I've seen her on the video and pictures but it's not the same as holding her, seeing her personality and facial expressions."

Lieutenant Whiddon arrived Oct. 4 from a four-and-a-half-month deployment with the 510th FS. During his deployment, he missed one of the most important dates of his and his daughter's life: the day she was born.

"I would have liked to be there, but there's no regret," the lieutenant said.

Married for three years, Lieutenant Whiddon and his wife, Sarah, were excited when they learned they were going to have a baby, though they also knew he was going to be deployed. Mrs. Whiddon knew before being married that instances like this happen to military families, servicemembers missing some of the most important events in the family. However, she didn't realize it was going to happen to them.

"It was bittersweet," Mrs. Whiddon said. "It was exciting but at the same time, William was not going to be here for the birth of his first daughter."

Lieutenant Whiddon was with his family through most of the pregnancy. When he deployed, his mother and the 510th FS wives' club took over to help Mrs. Whiddon with the last two weeks of the pregnancy.

"As soon as my contractions started, I e-mailed him that he needs to give me a call immediately because I knew I was going to the

hospital soon," Mrs. Whiddon said. "I wanted him to hear it from me before other people in the squadron."

During her 18 hours of labor at the 31st Medical Group hospital, the lieutenant regularly called to check how his wife was doing.

"It was intense, but the doctors and staff were absolutely wonderful," she said. "It was a good experience. The staff was very supportive especially since my husband wasn't there."

As for the lieutenant, all he could do was wait and pray.

"I was praying for everything to be alright," he said. "I was anxious, especially once I found out they were in the end stage. I was waiting on the phone."


Within a minute the baby was born, Lieutenant Whiddon's mom called to tell him the good news.

"I could hear my baby in the background, crying. That was good to hear," he said.

After a couple of hours, he received some of the photos of his baby. "It was special," Lieutenant Whiddon said. "It was good to see what she looked like. I would just imagine up to that point. She looked like me; she has my nose. It was neat."

During the rest of his deployment, Mrs. Whiddon would send her husband some photos of their baby. They would communicate through phone calls, and on Sunday evening, they would use a webcam to see each other.

"It's a big responsibility to know that I am going to shape my daughter's life, her values, and hopefully give

her direction when she gets older," Lieutenant Whiddon said. "I don't think I fully felt it until I saw her. It also gives me an appreciation for Sarah and how she handled everything."

The Whiddons spent most of their time together the first day he got back from deployment.

"We just enjoyed being together and let the baby get acquainted with the strange man who is now in the house," Lieutenant Whiddon said.

He may have missed the birth of his child, but meeting her for the first time, he said, "It was the most memorable moment of my life."

General Schwartz discusses change in the U.S. Air Force

WASHINGTON - The world has changed and the United States Air Force must change too, Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. Norton Schwartz said Oct. 12 at the National Press Club here.

General Schwartz made the point that political leaders have been dealing with the effects of globalization since the 1970s, but that the circumstances and conditions that globalization engenders continually change.

What the United States faces today, he said, is different than anything the nation has confronted in the past.

"The rub is, of course, that we can only estimate the nature of the future threats, the capabilities of potential adversaries or the topography of future operating environments," General Schwartz said. "We are not afforded, and never will be, complete certitude about such things."

The economic environment also influences the choices leaders must make and the paths the nation -- and the Air Force -- must follow. Trillion-dollar deficits will limit what the service can buy.

"We cannot commit substantial financial investments to prepare for an infinite variety of contingencies," he said. "We must be more flexible across a wide, but far from infinite range of contingencies, and (be) more versatile and efficient in everything we undertake."

The Air Force must balance today's needs with tomorrow's challenges, he said, adding that his service must be more agile and faster than in the past. That is nothing new to the Air Force, he added, as it is the nature of operations in air and space to be quick.

General Schwartz said the Air Force also must be more efficient.

"An important strategy is to reduce overhead operating costs, create more savings and shift them directly to force structure and modernization, and to warfighting needs," he said.

Being more efficient also requires a new way of working with others, General Schwartz said. The general said he and Adm. Gary Roughhead, the chief of naval operations, are fully committed to a new partnership called "Air-Sea Battle." The partnership, General Schwartz said, will enable the Navy and the Air Force to project power in new ways.

First, the Navy and Air Force will work together institutionally, General Schwartz said. A second way to work together, he said, calls for agreement on how Navy and Air Force systems will integrate and operate together.

"A third way of cooperating is materially with interoperability among current systems and integrated acquisition strategies for future joint capabilities," General Schwartz said. All this, he said, will amplify the services' effectiveness.

The U.S. Air Force defends the skies over the United States and allied countries and over friendly forces wherever they may be based, the general said. Precision strike worldwide, tanker and airlift support, satellite connectivity and early warning, he added, are all part of the Air Force's core mission. And, Airmen are helping to rebuild war-torn areas, conducting convoy operations, manning outposts and other non-traditional jobs, the general said.

Yet, "control of air and space; holding at risk practically any target on the Earth's surface; intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance; airlift and the command and control of air and space capabilities, again, will remain our most fundamental and enduring core contributions," General Schwartz said.

TRICARE celebrates women's health

Women make up almost one-half of the Military Health System's (MHS) 9.6 million beneficiaries.

TRICARE and the MHS observe Women's Health Month in October, recognizing that every female beneficiary should understand the resources available to them and the easy access to quality care.

"We want women to take full advantage of the preventive screenings and tests covered by TRICARE to protect their own health," said Kathie McCracken, Health Affairs program director for Patient Advocacy, Medical Ethics and Women's Health Issues.

"These include services like mammograms, Pap smears, cholesterol screening, colorectal cancer screenings, testing for diabetes and blood pressure screenings."

While women's health, in general, has improved significantly in the last century, much more can be done. For example, the leading cause of death in women is still heart disease, cancer and stroke, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. And for many female active duty service members, post-traumatic stress disorder and other behavioral issues still persist as a result of increased deployment.

To address these health conditions, TRICARE has numerous health programs that focus on disease prevention and health promotion. It is important that women talk to their primary care managers about their individual history, ask questions and make the decision that is right for them regarding screening and preventive care.

TRICARE female beneficiaries have a wide variety of preventive and routine services available to keep them healthy and help identify potential problems down the road. These beneficiaries need to keep in mind, there are limitations on the frequency of preventive care and coverage varies depending on whether a beneficiary is using TRICARE Prime or Standard. Cost-shares and deductibles may also apply.

Behavioral Health
TRICARE behavioral

health care services are available for beneficiaries and family members during times of stress, depression, grief and anxiety. TRICARE covers mental and behavioral health care that is medically or psychologically necessary. See www.tricare.mil/mental-health for more information.

Breast Cancer

TRICARE beneficiaries are entitled to an annual mammogram beginning at age 40 and at a doctor's discretion for women younger than 40 who are at high risk of developing breast cancer.

Beneficiaries identified as being at high risk for breast cancer (due to family history, etc.) are covered for annual mammograms beginning at age 35. TRICARE also covers magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) screenings for beneficiaries within the American Cancer Society's guidelines for a high risk of breast cancer. Colon cancer

TRICARE covers colonoscopy screenings once every 10 years beginning at age 50 for beneficiaries at average risk for colon cancer. Every two years beginning at age 25 (or five years younger than the earliest age of diagnosis of colon cancer in a family member, whichever is earlier) and then annually after age 40 for individuals with hereditary colon or rectal cancer.

Oral health

TRICARE approved an enhanced Maternity Dental Benefit through United Concordia, TRICARE's dental contractor. The enhanced benefit authorizes an additional cleaning at no cost for all pregnant TRICARE dental program enrollees. See www.tricare.mil/tdptws/home.jsp for more information.

Reproductive organ cancers

TRICARE covers pelvic examinations in conjunction with Pap smear testing when necessary or annually beginning at age 18 (or younger, if sexually active), until three consecutive normal Pap smears and then once every three years unless otherwise recommended by the physician.

Well-child care (birth-6 yrs)

TRICARE coverage includes routine newborn care for eligible newborns up to age 6; comprehensive health promotion and disease prevention exams; vision and hearing screenings; height, weight and head circumference; routine immunizations and developmental and behavioral appraisal in accordance with the American Academy of Pediatrics guidelines.

TRICARE Prime beneficiaries receive eye and vision screenings at birth and 6 months that test for visual acuity, ocular alignment and red reflex and then one comprehensive eye exam every two years.

TRICARE Standard and Extra beneficiaries receive eye and vision screenings at birth and 6 months that test for visual acuity, ocular alignment and red reflex and then two comprehensive eye exams between the ages of 3 and 6.

Halloween around the world

The kids of MAFB dressed up, with their parent's help, for Halloween Around the World, which was held Saturday, October 9th at the newly renovated library. There were dinosaurs, fairies, witches, even a robot and a Buzz Lightyear. A staff member dressed as a kitty and the library was filled with spider webs, ghosts and pumpkins galore.

The first activity of the event, the children participated in a scavenger hunt looking for certain decorations; with a tour guide to follow.

Once the scavenger hunt was completed the kids did a mummy walk over to the story time area. The kids got their silly wiggles out and their listening ears on and during story time, the kids made Halloween noises that had followed in the story.

Two Halloween children's books were read. The first book was called Friday Night

Flight by Laura Krauss Melmed. The story shows how we celebrate our Halloween tradition. In this story, a witch with her orange cat and a super jet-fueled broom set out to pick up her friends. The friends consisted of a vampire, a werewolf, a glamour ghost, a monster who came from a mad doctor's lab, a skeleton (which was once a living dog), and a mummy. Once everyone was on board the broom, they rode off to a house with pumpkins out front, rang the doorbell and said, "Trick or Treat!"

The second book was called The Day of the Dead; El Dia De Los Muertos. A bilingual celebration by Bob Barner and translated by Teresa Mlawer.

This book explains the Mexican tradition of their holiday; Day of the Dead. It was read to the children in both English and Spanish as it is laid out in the book.

In the tradition, the families will head out to their loved ones burials, lay out

a path for the spirits using petals and set by the tombstones, bundles of food that was prepared and cooked the day of. They light candles beneath the stars and burn incense while they sing, dance and play instruments to celebrate their ancestors.

After story time was over, the kids were told that they will visit a table of activity, but first they were to zombie walk over to the passport table. Each child was issued a paper passport; they would hold onto it for each activity they would visit.

They needed to get their passport stamped at each activity station. Once they got their passports, the kids headed on over to the Trick or Treat table where they got a bag and decorated it with ghoulish stickers. Once that was done, they were free to roam to any activity they wanted to visit; but at each table if they wanted sweets they would have to say the magic phrase: "Trick or Treat!"

There were six stations for trick or treaters to visit. A skeleton station; the kids crafted together a skeleton on colored paper using Qtips and glue. A paper marigold station; they made flowers using colored tissue paper and pipe cleaners.

Paper Lantern station; (which is a Japanese tradition), made lanterns using black and orange craft paper with a stapler. Face paint station where the "kitty" of the staff painted the children's faces.

And outside they had two game stations. One was the spider toss where they threw

rings onto the spider's legs and Pumpkin Chunkin where the kids tossed a beanbag into the netted holes of the pumpkin.

The kids enjoyed the event very much and the parents seemed pleased with the set up. The event was done in one hour, which is perfect when working with children.
