A commander's call of a different color

JOINT BASE ANDREWS, Md. - When you hear you're having a wing commander's call, what comes to mind? Some might think of the loud chants each squadron shouts. Others might hope they get there early enough to snag a nice seat in the back and, let's be honest, some just hope to make it through without getting caught with their eyes closed or their cell phone going off. The point is, that no matter if you've been in the Air Force for a few years or a few decades, commander's calls are, for the most part, always the same.

The Airmen from the 11th Wing now may think a little differently after attending

the 11th WG commander's call on the flightline here Nov. 2, led by Col. Ken Rizer, the 11th WG/Joint Base Andrews commander and Chief Master Sgt. Anthony Brinkley, 11 WG/Joint Base Andrews command chief.

Hundreds of 11th WG Airmen packed in shoulder-to-shoulder on four outdoor bleachers on the JB Andrews flightline, facing formations of the Air Force Band to the right and the Air Force Honor Guard to the left. In the center, was a stage set up with drums, electric guitars and microphones. But there was only something missing: where were the commander and command chief?

Shortly after everyone was settled in their seats, a 1st Helicopter Squadron UH-1N Iroquois landed on the flightline approximately 50 yards

from the stage. Out sprung an 11th Security Forces Squadron emergency services team in a diamond formation escorting Colonel Rizer and Chief Brinkley to the staging area. The EST unit was just one of the units on hand to showcase its mission, ensuring 360 degree security around its "protectees."

"Colonel Rizer and I get to see everything the 11th WG does from the top down," Chief Brinkley said. "But some of you have not had the opportunity and privilege to see some of the things we witness on a daily basis. So today, we are going to showcase you to yourselves. This will be a commander's call like you've never seen before."

Following performances by the Air Force Band and the Air Force Honor Guard, several 11th WG Airmen and

civilians were highlighted to feature the important missions they perform every day across the wing. As each person and their mission was introduced, the crowd cheered them on as they ran through an honor guard cordon, greeted at the end by Colonel Rizer and Chief Brinkley.

The crowd was then treated to performances by the Air Force Band's Airmen of Note, the premier jazz ensemble of the Air Force, the Singing Sergeants, the official chorus of the Air Force, and Max Impact, an Air Force performing unit that blends different styles of music to entertain and inspire its listeners.

The Air Force Honor Guard drill team followed the musical performances and kept exhibited their level of precision and timing they used to execute each of their

maneuvers. The final performance belonged to the 1st HS, which simulated an alert scramble. At the sound of the siren, four flight teams raced from the alert facility into four UH-1Ns and took off in a matter of minutes, exemplifying their vigilance and quick-response capabilities to the crowd.

Colonel Rizer said the 11th WG principles -- vigilance, precision and global impact -- were evident in every aspect of the commander's call and it's not just the units on display that exemplify those traits. "Every single one of you plays a critical role as part of the 11th WG," Colonel Rizer said. "What you saw today was excellence in action and...hopefully, you are as proud to be a part of the 11th WG as I am."

Apple Cheddar Pie



3 pounds Granny Smith apples, peeled and cut in 1/4-inch slices (about 8 cups)
 1/3 cup all-purpose flour
 3/4 cup sugar
 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
 1 tablespoon lemon juice
 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
 1/4 teaspoon salt
 2 tablespoons butter, diced into bits
 1 (15-ounce) package refrigerated piecrust dough (2 crusts)
 3 ounces extra sharp Cheddar cheese, shredded
 1 egg, lightly beaten

1. Preheat oven to 375F. Line a pie plate with one pie crust, gently pressing dough into sides, and letting excess hang over the edge.
2. In a large bowl, combine apples, flour, sugar, cinnamon, nutmeg, lemon juice, vanilla and salt. Spoon into pie crust and scatter bits of butter evenly over filling. Top with an even layer of cheese.
3. Drape second crust loosely over filling. Pull excess from the bottom crust over edge of top crust and crimp to enclose. Flute edge decoratively. Brush top crust lightly with beaten egg and use a sharp knife to make 4 to 5 small (1/2-inch) slits.
4. Bake until top is golden brown and fruit is bubbling and tender, about 50 to 55 minutes. If crust browns too quickly, drape pie lightly with foil and continue cooking.
5. Let cool at least 15 minutes before serving. Serves 8.

AF command brings focus to nuclear enterprise

WASHINGTON (AFNS)

- Over the past 15 months, Air Force officials have built from scratch a model new command that will sustain and modernize U.S. intercontinental ballistic missile wings and the nuclear-capable bomber fleet, said the general who leads the new command.

"Some people have likened that to trying to build an airplane while actually having to fly it," Lt. Gen. Frank G. Klotz told a group of defense reporters here Nov. 9. "And at times, it has seemed like that to us."

Global Strike Command is the Air Force's first new major command in 27 years. It's also part of a larger strategy that Air Force Secretary Michael B. Donley and Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. Norton Schwartz drafted "to bring focus and attention back to the nuclear enterprise," General Klotz said.

The command, activated in August 2009 with headquarters at Barksdale Air Force Base, La., has gone from 47 permanent staff and an equal number of temporary-duty staff to a staff of 800, plus 100 contractors.

"We had to publish the guidance, the instructions and the checklists that govern activities inside the bomber and the ICBM worlds," General Klotz said. "As it turned out, we had to write nearly 200 of these documents that were several hundred pages long and ensure that they got trained

and implemented in the field. It's a pretty daunting task."

The command is responsible for three ICBM wings, two B-52 Stratofortress wings and a B-2 Spirit wing. About 23,000 people assigned to the command work in locations around the world.

For the first time since the end of the Cold War, General Klotz said, the two Air Force legs of the nuclear triad -- which is composed of land-based ICBMs, strategic bombers and ballistic-missile submarines -- are back under one command.

During the Cold War, Strategic Air Command was responsible for the Air Force segments of the triad.

"At the end of the Cold War, ... those responsibilities were divested," General Klotz said. "The bombers went to Air Combat Command and the ICBMs went to ... Air Force Space Command."

That meant two different commands with two different commanders and two different organizations with different priorities and different resources were focusing on the Air Force nuclear enterprise, General Klotz said.

"Our thought was that there was some fraying in the nuclear enterprise as a result," he said, "and to bring focus back to the enterprise, a number of steps were taken, including creation of the Air Force Global Strike Command." In April 2009, President Barack Obama told a large audience in Hradany Square in Prague in the Czech Republic that the United States would take concrete steps toward help-

ing to create a world without nuclear weapons.

"We will reduce the role of nuclear weapons in our national security strategy and urge others to do the same," President Obama said, adding that as long as such weapons exist, the United States "will maintain a safe, secure and effective arsenal to deter any adversary, and guarantee that defense to our allies."

That position is manifest in the Defense Department's April 2010 Nuclear Posture Review Report, General Klotz said, "and in the attention to our enterprise provided by senior leadership from (Defense Secretary Robert M. Gates) on down, as well as the re-sourcing that goes with it."

Still, the number of U.S. nuclear weapons is declining, from nine operational bases and 1,054 missiles to three bases today and 450 missiles, he said. During the Cold War, Strategic Air Command had more than 1,000 bombers. Today, 76 B-52s and 20 B-2s make up the bomber inventory.

"But I still think there is a compelling need for a balance across the bomber, the ICBM and the sea-launched ballistic legs," General Klotz said.

General Klotz said he also supports ratification of a new strategic arms reduction treaty between the United States and Russia, which together are stewards of more than 90 percent of the world's nuclear weapons. The old START treaty lapsed Dec. 5, and the Senate has not yet

voted on the new treaty.

"The secretary of defense, the chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, the commander of (U.S.) Strategic Command and virtually every former commander of Strategic Command have very cogent and compelling arguments in favor of ratifying the treaty," he said.

General Klotz, who has been working in arms control and arms control policy since the mid-1970s, said such a treaty facilitates important communication between the two largest nuclear powers.

"It's critically important that the United States and Russia ... have a continuous dialog on issues related to nuclear policy, including such areas as security, safety and command and control," he said.

"This type of interaction in which the arms control treaties are the centerpiece, the nexus around which all that takes place, are critically important for understanding, for transparency and for openness between the two largest nuclear powers," the general added.


