## Crew chief program motivates performance

A select, highly-skilled group of Barksdale maintainers were recently recognized for their commitment to aircraft performance and equipment condition by being named dedicated crew chiefs.

The recently re-established Dedicated Crew Chief Program has been an Air Force tradition for decades and gives crew chiefs the opportunity to be recognized as the top crew chiefs of Barksdale, home of Air Force Global Strike Command.

"The dedicated crew chief becomes the focal point for knowing their aircraft; the nooks and crannies, the quirks, the history," said Tech. Sgt. Tracey Williams, 20th Aircraft Maintenance Unit Airframe Powerplant General assistant section chief. "They become a part of the jets legacy for putting combat power in the air and bombs on target."

To do so, the dedicated crew chiefs are responsible for all maintenance on the assigned aircraft they are dedicated to as well as perform preflight, thru-flight, hourly post-

flight, and launch and recovery actions in direct support of their unit's flying schedule, which is above and beyond that of the duties of a crew chief. They also provide a safe and reliable weapons platform in support of flight crews conducting global operational taskings.

The dedicated crew chiefs are evaluated out of the best-of-the-best crew chiefs from the group of eligible APG; then they are put through a one-week program to enhance their skills.

Since the dedicated crew chiefs and assistant dedicated crew chiefs are selected on the basis of initiative, leadership, management ability, technical knowledge, and experience, the title of dedicated crew chief is a title to strive for.

"This position is one that maintainers strive for," said Staff Sgt. Sean Ahern, 96th Aircraft Maintenance Unit dedicated crew chief. "To know that the Air Force trusts me with the responsibility of ensuring this aircraft is completely mission-capable draws a great sense of pride. Being a part of this program

allows maintenance to be more proficient and produce the highest quality of work, which improves the flying program."

Although still not 100 percent manned, leadership, managers and technicians alike believe a revitalized Dedicated Crew Chief Program will have a positive impact on the mission and unit moral.

According to Master Sgt. David Bennett, 96th Aircraft Maintenance Unit APG section chief,

directly assigning a maintenance Airman to each Barksdale aircraft, continuity and accuracy of aircraft forms, status's and scheduled maintenance is provided and aircraft appearance and performance is improved, thus helping to ensure mission success.

"Our dedicated crew chiefs devotion to the mission makes them stand out," said Capt. Tanisha Washington, 20th Aircraft Maintenance Unit officer in charge. "Their amount of knowledge of the aircraft is above and beyond what is expected from them, they give that little extra whether it's staying behind to make sure their jet looks the best or they fix delayed discrepancies in the forms for preventative maintenance without being asked, we already have the best crew chiefs in the Air Force, so our dedicated crew chiefs are truly the best of the best."

Each quarter, we host an Airman Birthday and Appreciation Dinner. We proudly serve a delicious steak and shrimp dinner, a side course of fun games with very nice prizes, followed by some delectable cake.

Holiday meals are our favorite. We spend days preparing for these awesome occasions and cannot wait to display the culinary talents of the food operations team. We just had an awesome Thanksgiving meal with AFGSC and wing leadership took over server duties for the day. 

All civilian and military personnel of the U.S. or a foreign government, retirees and family of deployed members may use the flight kitchen.

# Barksdale volunteers spread holiday cheer

The Barksdale Enlisted Spouse Group will host its third annual Christmas card hand out program Saturday at the Overton Brooks VA Medical Center in Shreveport to help spread cheer to local veterans during the holiday season.

During the annual Christmas card program, purchased and hand-made Christmas cards are collected, sorted and given to veterans in the local community by the BESG and Airmen assigned to Air Force Global Strike Command.

Though the program is primarily hosted by the BESG, Program Director Rachel Penwell said the event is open to anyone who wants to help.

"In the past, many family members from both spouse groups, as well as military members have participated in the event," she said. "When we send the invitation out, we actually encourage people to have their spouse and children participate."

The idea for the cards for veterans program originated three years ago with Penwell and a fellow BESG member.

"We both really had a passion and wanted to do something for our veteran community — we wanted to show them that they are still very much appreciated," she said.

Penwell said they chose to adopt the veterans at the VA hospital because they'd learned that many of them didn't have family around.

"We took the project and ran with

it," she said. "The first year we collected more than 1,000 signed and home-made cards — much more than we ever imagined.

Penwell recalls being amazed at the amount of cards they'd collected.

"I remember looking across my living room floor — and there was just a sea of Christmas cards," she said. "After the event, I realized how much something so simple meant to the veterans, and the BESG decided this would be a program we would continue every year. I never knew such a simple act could bring so much joy."

Though the annual card hand-out is a group effort, Penwell said she would continue to do it even if the organization didn't, because of how much it means to the veterans.

"I participate because of how much it means to the veterans, many of who will spend the holiday season alone," she said. "I love seeing the reaction from the veterans when they are handed the cards. Many are shocked that they were even thought of."

Master Sgt. Kelly Walter, a returning volunteer assigned to the 8th Air Force communications division, said the response to the volunteerism varies from person to person, but the one thing that keeps her coming back is the joy they are able to bring — if even for just a few moments.

"I look forward to talking to each person and letting them share their stories. I let them know I appreciate their service and that we care," she said. "Some are very ill and just


give simple thanks and don't care to talk, but others are so happy to get visitors and like to look through the cards with you and talk. Some of the older vets do enjoy telling you where they served and when and they also enjoy that we are so eager to listen."

The sergeant said that as an active-duty member herself, she thought it important to find ways to give back to those that served before her.

"I'm not quite sure what impact this might make in the community, but if even for those few moments it gives a vet stuck in a hospital a few moments of joy, then it is so worth it," she said. "We owe so much to our vets and it is just one small way to let them know that no matter what their circumstance is we know they are there and we appreciate them. Plus it gives them a chance to have a visit if they want one, and to see someone other than the hospital staff. They know we are there because we want to be."

The group hopes to return to the hospital this year with at least 1,000 cards and plenty of volunteers.

"I just encourage everybody to reach out either through this program or another to help a veteran and show them they are not forgotten," Sergeant Walter said. "The holiday season is about giving and it is not the monetary gifts that matter to the heart. When the trees and decorations are all put away, it is the gift of your time and giving of yourself that will have mattered."

# Barksdale cracks down on Spice use

The dangers of a relatively new drug that quickly gained popularity has urged state legislatures, the Drug Enforcement Agency and the military to take action to make it illegal.

Spice, a synthetic marijuana, is a mixture of herbs with hallucinogenic effects similar to marijuana. The quantity and toxicity of the herbs varies in each product, making some more potent than others. It's typically consumed by smoking, creating a euphoric feeling comparable to cannabis.

The Air Force has caught numerous Airmen smoking Spice during the past year and explicitly banned it in June. Barksdale, home of Air Force Global Strike Command, is doing their part to ensure good conduct among the servicemembers here.

"The Air Force has been crystal clear that those who use Spice — a substance now illegal both at the Federal and State level — will be held accountable," said Col. Tim Fay, 2nd Bomb Wing commander. "Pursuant to Air Force policy, the illegal or improper use of any drug is incompatible with military service and automatically places the member's continued service in jeopardy."

Numerous official videos about Spice are also popping up on Facebook, iTunes and YouTube.

The official message conveys an urgent health risk and warns troops

that smoking the chemical-soaked herbal blend is punishable under the Uniform Code of Military Justice as a wrongful use of any intoxicating substance not intended for human ingestion.

The chemicals are not approved by the Food and Drug Administration for human consumption, the DEA said in its federal notice. Doctors reported a surge in patients sickened by use of Spice, commonly having a rapid heart rate, dangerously high blood pressure and sometimes hallucinations or paranoia.

"In June, the Air Force specifically banned the substance by revising AFI 44-121, making Spice use a violation of Article 92, UCMJ, for failure to obey a lawful regulation. Even more recently, the DEA has designated Spice and other synthetic marijuana drugs as Schedule I substances. This makes any use, possession, or distribution of the drug after the effective date of 24 December 2010 a violation of federal law and chargeable under Article 112a exactly as

most other drug offenses are charged in the military," said Capt. Wells Littlefield, Chief of Military Justice for the 2nd Bomb Wing. "Despite these developments, the military has always prosecuted the use of any drug that is mood or mind altering, including Spice, under Article 134 if it could not specifically charge it under Article 112a."

The Armed Forces Institute of Pathology staff is also in the process of developing a urine/blood test for Spice. When caught, the punishment can be as serious as a dishonorable discharge, forfeiture of all pay and allowances, confinement and a reduction to the lowest enlisted rank. In addition, if any military member is caught for drug use, a mandatory discharge process is initiated.

According to Special Agent Robert Keys, Superintendent, AFOSI Detachment 210, law enforcement has several different technologies to determine who is purchasing Spice and where it is being bought and received. Jointly, OSI and the 2nd Security Forces Squadron are working together to terminate this behavior.

With so much at jeopardy, Colonel Fay asks Barksdale Airmen to not allow any drug to affect the operational readiness of the 2nd Bomb Wing. "Your nation and your Air Force need each one of you — please do not put your future at risk for this."

# Good order and discipline at Barksdale

### From the 2nd Bomb Wing Office of the Staff Judge Advocate

A lower-level adverse action is nonjudicial punishment pursuant to Article 15, Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ). A commander can impose nonjudicial punishment of correctional custody, forfeiture of pay, reduction in grade, extra duties, reprimand and restriction. Certain punishments may also be suspended up to six months. If the member commits any subsequent misconduct during a period of suspension, the suspended punishment may be vacated and implemented.

The following Airmen received nonjudicial punishment in November 2010:

#### 2nd Maintenance Squadron

A staff sergeant received nonjudicial punishment for violation of Article 86, absent without leave, Article 107, false official statement, and Article 134, disorderly conduct. Punishment imposed consisted of a suspended reduction to the grade of senior airman, forfeiture of \$225 pay per month for two months, and a reprimand.

A staff sergeant received nonjudicial punishment for violation of Article 112a, wrongful use of a prescription medication. Punishment imposed consisted of a suspended reduction to the grade of senior airman. The member will also be processed for administrative discharge.

#### 2nd Civil Engineer Squadron

An airman 1st class received

nonjudicial punishment for violation of Article 92, misuse of a Government Travel Card. Punishment imposed consisted of a reduction to the grade of airman and a reprimand.

#### 2nd Aircraft Maintenance Squadron

A senior airman received nonjudicial punishment for violation of Article 111, drunk driving. Punishment imposed consisted of a reduction to the grade of airman 1st class with an additional reduction to the grade of airman suspended, forfeiture of \$100 pay with an additional forfeiture of \$150 pay suspended and 14 days extra duty.

#### 2nd Logistics Readiness Squadron

A senior airman received non-

judicial punishment for violation of Article 111, drunk driving. Punishment imposed consisted of a reduction to the grade of airman 1st class with an additional reduction to the grade of airman suspended, 45 days restriction, 15 days extra duty and a reprimand.

#### 26th Operational Weather Squadron

An airman 1st class received nonjudicial punishment for violation of Article 112a, wrongful use of a prescription medication. Punishment imposed consisted of a reduction to the grade of airman and suspended forfeitures of \$811 pay per month for two months. The member will also be processed for administrative discharge.

#### 2nd Communications Squadron

An airman received nonjudicial punishment for violation of Article 92, failure to obey a lawful order, and Article 107, false official statement. Punishment imposed consisted of a reduction to the grade of airman basic, suspended forfeitures of \$723 pay per month for two months and 45 days extra duty.

#### 2nd Force Support Squadron

A senior airman received nonjudicial punishment for violation of Article 112a, wrongful use of marijuana. Punishment imposed consisted of a reduction to the grade of airman 1st class and suspended forfeitures of \$691 pay. The member is being processed for administrative discharge.


