

Annual training converted to one-time occurrence

Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Training has been converted from an annual training requirement to a one-time training event aimed at motivating Airmen who observe an inappropriate or unsafe situation to act.

The new class, Sexual Assault Bystander Intervention Training, is mandatory for all military members and civilians who supervise military. This includes Air Force Global Strike Command, 8th Air Force, 2nd Bomb Wing and all Reserve and tenant units on base. The training is conducted in groups of 25 individuals or less, which are divided by rank and gender.

"This training is designed to try to help people understand that they can intervene in potentially inappropriate or dangerous situations effectively," said Capt. Dallas Webb, 2nd Force Support Squadron Sexual Assault Response Coordinator. "We are trying to encourage people to understand what those situations can look like and give them some options as to what they think they can do to help."

Captain Webb said the new training is more effective due to smaller class sizes and more interactive lessons.

"I think it's great that the Department of Defense did away with all those slides and having 300 people crammed into a room, it was just too much information coming from the same person," she said. "I think the open discussions allowed between 25 folks around the same peer level, helps individuals feel that open and honest discussion is available to them — I think that is the only way we can learn sexual assault prevention."

AF AF begins fundraising campaign

Barksdale, home to Air Force Global Strike Command, has kicked off the Air Force Assistance Fund, which provides support to the Air Force family — active duty, retirees, reservists, guard and their dependents, including surviving spouses in need. To do this, they count on support from Team Barksdale during their 2011 AF AF campaign, now through March 25.

"Barksdale's monetary goal this year is \$113,000," said 2nd Lt. Ryan Huff, 2nd Maintenance Operations Squadron maintenance training flight commander. "The money goes directly back to Airmen in need during emergencies. Last year, \$248,018 was given to Barksdale Airmen and \$101,188 was raised during AF AF Campaign."

The campaign supports four organizations: the Air Force Aid Society, the Air Force Village Widows Fund, the General and Mrs. Curtis E. LeMay Foundation and the Air Force Enlisted Village Widows' Fund.

"By donating, the AF AF benefits the Air Force mission by aiding in times of an emergency, with educational needs and have a secure retirement home for widows or widowers of Air Force members in need of financial assistance," said Staff Sgt. Barian Smith, 608th Air Operations Command tactical data-link manager.

The Air Force Aid Society has provided worldwide emergency assistance to Airmen and their families and sponsored educational and proactive community programs to improve quality of life.

The Air Force Enlisted Village mission is to provide a home for surviving spouses of retired enlisted Air Force members. The program offers the hand of kindness and the gift of a home. It also offers temporary housing to the surviving spouses of enlisted members

who died while on active duty. AF EV has been home to more than 1,500 surviving spouses since 1975.

"Out of everything, we are asked to give for people we may never meet. This is our chance to truly help the men and women that serve next to us, both past and present," Lieutenant Huff said.

The LeMay Foundation helps widows of all Air Force retirees, both officers and enlisted, through financial grants of assistance. These widows spend much of their lives coping with the difficulties of military life and supporting their spouses through years of active duty.

The Air Force Village is a retirement community with a charitable mission, which is to care for retired Air Force officer widows who need financial assistance. The AFV has contributed more than \$12 million in confidential support to indigent widows since 1970.

"It's nice to be a part of something bigger than yourself, and it's great that Airmen have taken the wingman concept into effect and continue to contribute to the AF AF," Sergeant Smith said. "Airmen can get involved by simply contacting their unit point of contact; 100 percent contact is necessary."

Do you know your child's dental health needs?

February is Children's Dental Health Month, and the Barksdale Dental Clinic will address common questions regarding infant oral health care asked often by our first-time parents.

When should you start caring for your baby's teeth?

It is actually a good idea to get in the habit of cleaning your baby's gums even before teeth emerge. To clean your baby's mouth, lay your baby in your lap using the orientation easiest for you and your infant. Gently rub a clean and damp piece of gauze or washcloth along both the upper and lower gums. Cleaning your baby's gums after every feeding is ideal, but at a minimum clean the child's gums at least two times per day — after breakfast and after the last feeding of the day. As your child's teeth begin to erupt, which is usually at around six months, look for a baby toothbrush with a small, soft bristle head and larger grip suitable for your hand.

Should I use toothpaste to clean my baby's teeth?

As long as you're cleaning your child's teeth regularly, you don't need to use any toothpaste

yet. Just brush the teeth gently on both the outside and inside surfaces twice a day. Brush the tongue as well, if they will let you, to remove the bacteria that can cause bad breath. One quick swipe is enough. Replace the toothbrush as soon as the bristles start to look worn or splayed out. A little fluoride is a good thing for your baby's teeth, but too much of it can lead to a condition called fluorosis, which in mild cases causes white spots to show up on your child's adult teeth.

Academy of Pediatric Dentistry recommends waiting until your child is two years old to use fluoridated toothpaste and even then you should let him use only a tiny, pea-sized amount each time. Young children tend to swallow their toothpaste rather than spit it out and swallowing too much fluoridated toothpaste over time can lead to fluorosis.

When do I need to take my child to the dentist?

The American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry and the American Dental Association recommend you bring your baby to see a dentist between 6 and 12


months of age. An early dental exam might identify a problem early therefore preventing cavities. Establishing a relationship with a dentist early-on provides families with a source for important dental information as well as routine and emergency dental care.

Baby teeth are important because they allow for a proper diet, jaw growth, giving the face its form and appearance, assist in the formation of proper speech and, most important, act as space savers for adult teeth. Tooth decay in babies can lead to pain, infection, malnutrition and premature loss of teeth, which can affect the development of permanent teeth. Good oral health habits started at an early age at home increases the chance for a healthy mouth during your child's young life and carries on through adulthood.

Bigger, better facility for 2 SFS Airmen

Nearly 300 Air Force Global Strike Command 2nd Security Forces Airmen have been operating out of a 1930s vintage hangar for more than 11 years.

A new 46,645 square foot complex is in the works to accommodate an effective command and control center for all security operations, which is due for completion April 15. The facility will comply with antiterrorism and force protection requirements and have an orderly flow and cost effective design.

"The new complex will give our Airmen advanced individual training we previously never had at Barksdale," said Lt. Col. JonPaul Mickle, 2 SFS commander. "The complex will also ensure the capability of a command and control center in one central location."

The Security Forces complex project was generated in 1998 and finally

broke ground in March 2010. The new \$14.6 million facility is located strategically for response and accessibility on Lindbergh Avenue, north of the 8th Air Force Museum.

There will be four major sections in the SF complex: the central core, which includes the emergency center; command and control, the command headquarters, operations section and logistics and training wing.

The facility's detention area with medium and maximum jail cells will be located in the complex as well as the armory and the guard-mount room. The complex also includes an auditorium, training rooms, and 472 locker spaces for all security forces Airmen. The Pass and I.D. office will also be housed in the complex.

"We will have the coordination and defense resources to better police Airman of Barksdale," Colonel Mickle said.

The complex will incorporate more

parking for security forces individuals and visitors and includes a vehicle wash rack for special purpose vehicles and a perimeter security chain-link. There will be two access roads to Lindbergh Avenue, which allows for quicker response time to the Barksdale community.

The collocation of SF functions will eliminate several days' preparation for deployment processing. Current mobility equipment is stored in three different areas, where it must be retrieved, built and transported. The new facility will allow all equipment to be under one roof and pallets can remain configured. Deploying unit members will also be able to complete out-processing functions in one location, said Christopher Bowman, 2 SFS chief plans and programs.

"This is an outstanding facility for an absolutely awesome group of defenders," said Senior Master Sgt. Kevin Owens, 2 SFS first sergeant.

Despite the gravity of the material, Captain Webb does her best to deliver the information in an entertaining way in hopes of reaching out to more Airmen.

"Sexual assault is a very serious matter, but I try to make the class fun and leave topics open for discussion — we added some humor to it as well," she said.

Many of the Airmen who have attended the training have agreed the method of delivery makes the material easier to digest.

"I definitely got a lot out of this training; it's probably the best SARC training I've had in my career," said Master Sgt. Kenneth Esaw, 2 FSS in-service recruiter. "Sometimes with these briefings it's all in the presentation; this was very informative and interactive and you get a lot of input from the audience so you get to see lots of different viewpoints."

The training event must be completed by all eligible members by June 2012, a deadline Captain Webb is dedicated to meeting.

"We have a long way to go — we've trained more than 1,500 people, and from what I've been told there are more than 7,500 individuals that need to be trained on this base," she said. "One way or the other we are going to get this base to 100 percent trained by June 2012, even if I have to come in on weekends or whatever else I need to do to accomplish that goal."

"I will be attending training soon that will help me teach other people on base to give the bystander intervention brief. Eventually, my victim advocates will be given the reins to teach some of these bystander intervention training classes. That way it won't come down to the wire where we are trying to get everyone trained by the deadline," she continued.

"I definitely got a lot out of this training; it's probably the best SARC training I've had in my career. Sometimes with these briefings it's all in the presentation; this was very informative and interactive."

Celebrating African American History Month has been a part of this nation for more than 80 years.





Spice, bath salt testing

Military drug testing laboratories now possess the capability to test urine specimens for synthetic cannabinoids as well as MDPV, mephedrone and other known chemicals commonly found in bath salts. Spice and products sold as "bath salts," in their many forms, are increasingly known to be very dangerous drugs. Airmen should be aware the ingestion of any substance, other than alcohol or tobacco, for the purpose of altering mood or function is a violation of AFI 44-121 and punishable under Article 92, Uniform Code of Military Justice.

Dangerous chemical banned

A series of dangerous chemicals being marketed as "bath salts" or "plant food" have been added to the Controlled Dangerous Substance Act, making it illegal to possess, manufacture or distribute them in Louisiana. These products are being marketed by the brand names Ivory Wave, Ocean, Charge +, White Lightning, Scarface, Hurricane Charlie, Red Dove, Cloud-9 and White Dove. 


