## AFGSC bids farewell to first Command Chief

Air Force Global Strike Command's first command chief, Chief Master Sgt. Jack Johnson, recently sat down to reflect on his role in building a major command from scratch.

"While Global Strike Command was born out of a series of mistakes, the people in place today have stepped out of that shadow," Chief Johnson said as he prepared to move on to the Senior Enlisted Leader position at U.S. Africa Command. "We buried that. We learned from it, we'll never forget it, but that's not who we are. We're moving forward, and we're not looking back."

Chief Johnson said "firsts" are always special, and being the first command chief for Air Force Global Strike Command gave him a unique feeling of closeness with the command's Airmen and their families.

"When you build a foundation with great leaders and a great team, it is very different than coming in and taking over for someone else — I'm going to miss the team," the chief said.

The goal of rebuilding a nuclear and global strike culture is on track, the chief said. He said he's seen the Airmen of Air Force Global Strike Command accepting the special trust and responsibility for "the most lethal infrastructure in the world."

More than a year and a half after the standup of the command, Chief Johnson said the Command's ability to "deter and assure" has been widely publicized, and it is a unique mission.

# Capture leadership lessons

I never thought I'd be dolling out words of wisdom or advice, but I can guarantee you I have learned some lessons throughout my life and career — some the easy way, but many more the hard way.

I have not encountered anything overly extraordinary or unique and I am not going to tell you anything you have not heard or read elsewhere; however, wisdom and good advice tend to come around time and again in many forms and fashions, some in stories and others in actions.

Maybe I'll share something new with you or rekindle a memory of something once told to you before. I've collected some golden nuggets along the way and added some tools to my bag; however, I still make mistakes and learn something new each every day and continue to improve myself.

I reflect upon my actions and think critically on how I can do things better next time and pass those lessons along to others, in hopes they may learn from my experiences. Until a few years ago I depended upon my memory to retain all those pearls of wisdom, but my plan and memory both fell short; with age memory tends to fade.

To combat my not so reliant memory my best friend gave me a leadership journal to transcribe those lessons and thoughts and I have used it ever since. My journal has served me well, I use it daily. I challenge you to do the same, start a journal today and carry it on your person so you can jot those ideas and lessons down. Take time daily to reflect upon them and then share them with others. I'd like to share a few of the lessons and thoughts I've written in my journal; some are light hearted while others cut to the core of our existence as a military fighting force.

One of the senior noncommissioned officers in my squadron recently retired; however, prior to his departure he spent every extra moment in the maintenance bay passing along his knowledge to the noncommissioned officers and Airmen. He had always done this, but he was not content with the more than 20 years of mentoring he had already accomplished.

He had more to give and he did in those few months. It was a magnificent sight to watch him teach and mentor his subordinates and they soaked up every bit of knowledge he had to offer. I commend him for his efforts and for sprinting across the finish of his military career. He left everything with the next generation. There is one bit of advice I overheard him tell his Airmen I took note of and I have used it myself on several occasions.

It goes somewhat along the lines of, "you can't choose to have one foot in the civilian world and one in the military; you've got to jump into your military career with both feet in order to achieve success. This isn't just a job, it's a profession. Be dedicated to what you do every day."

He was definitely preaching the right message and I'll always remember the words I overheard in his final days. He left a legacy of excellence behind and I am proud to tell you his section is doing extremely well to this day and his efforts were instrumental to the reinvigoration of our nuclear enterprise. We all must ensure our feet are squarely planted into the service to our nation. In our shrinking Air Force we know we have to rely heavily on each and every Airman to perform their duties, they must be committed for us to remain the world's greatest Air Force.

As a commander, I put a tremendous focus on training; it is one of the greatest investments we can make in our Airmen. Upgrade training in particular sets the foundation and provides a solid vector for our Airmen to follow throughout their careers. As our manning numbers continue to decline, we can no longer depend upon manpower redundancy to get the job done and we cannot stretch the hours in a day. As a munitions officer I offer an ammo analogy to clarify how we must operate to be successful.

We used to carpet bomb our enemies with hundreds of general purpose bombs to ensure we hit the target, but now we utilize precision guided weapons to achieve greater success with finite effort and little or no collateral damage. Each and every Airman is a precision guided weapon with tremendous value and worth; we must maintain, sustain, and

plan for the next generation. Our potential adversaries continue to organize, train, and equip their forces; we must do the same, and better. Again, I challenge and encourage you to invest the time and effort in training your Airmen to the highest standards. Do not allow them to aim for the minimum passing scores; challenge them to hit the 90s. Invest your own time and effort to aid in their success; a little time now yields significant benefits later and translates into mission success. I guarantee you will grow competent and technically proficient Airmen who are truly — fire and forget weapons.

I want to share another analogy I tell my newcomers; I think it's beneficial and on point. It goes something like this.

Each day we each step into our workplaces and carry our individual workloads — please consider it our bucket. We all must carry our own buckets to ensure the mission gets accomplished. I am confident you will agree each of our buckets is nearly full to the top, not much room before things start to spill over. If necessary we could disperse some of our load for a short while; however, you should never put a fellow Airman in a position to carry your bucket. Hold your personnel accountable; ensure they are carrying their load each and every day. If we work as team we can accomplish our goals and achieve mission success. Carry your own bucket and take great pride in what you do and know your work is a direct reflection of you!

Maybe you read something you have not come across in your career yet or perhaps I sparked a memory of some great advice or wisdom passed along to you before. If you had forgotten it, write it down in your new journal and share with others. Strive to make your successors better than you and your unit better before you leave or retire. Encourage your Airmen to jump into their careers with both feet and commit to the profession of arms. Remind them mission success is not a destination, it is a continual journey. Invest the necessary time and effort into training our Airmen. Finally, set high goals for them, make them aim for the stars, if they fall short they are still flying high; they must be better than we are — they are our greatest resource and our future.

# Defenders of Liberty Air Show acts announced

Barksdale Air Force Base, home of Air Force Global Strike Command, announces the 2011 Defenders of Liberty Air Show on May 7-8, featuring the F-22 Demo Team.

"I think the public is really going to enjoy this year's air show," said Maj. Chris Otis, 20th Bomb Squadron, and 2011 air show air boss. "Our headliner this year is the F-22 Demo Team, they only visit a handful of bases every year, so we are happy to have them. Not only do we have a thrilling display of the F-22 and its capabilities, but we also have the recreation team Tora Tora Tora, as well as the Shockwave Jet Truck, which is always a crowd favorite."

Tora Tora Tora provides a dynamic history lesson through recreation of the Dec. 7, 1941, attack on Pearl Harbor. The group travels with volunteers that work

as ground crew, maintenance, pyrotechnic experts and pilots to provide smoke, fire and explosions while an announcer explains the events and historical significance to the crowd.

Also new to this year's air show is husband and wife duo, Amanda and Kyle Franklin — they will be performing their most popular act, Pirated Skies. Inspired by the popular movie "Pirates of the Caribbean" — Captain Kyro, Kyle and Scandalous Scarlett, Amanda, sword fight through the sky while reaching speeds of up to 180 mph and while performing tail slides, torque rolls and snap rolls.

The expected 200,000 crowd in attendance will also see returning acts from past air shows including: Greg Poe, the Shockwave Jet Truck, Jacquie B. and the Vintage Warbirds.

The air show is free and

open to members of the public. Gates will open at 9 a.m. and the show will begin at 10 a.m., all acts will perform both Saturday and Sunday weather permitting.

Col. Tim Fay, 2nd Bomb Wing commander, encouraged the local community to come enjoy the show.

"Defenders of Liberty is one of the greatest air shows in our nation," he said. "It is an outstanding opportunity for all of Team Barksdale to thank our community and show America some of the tools we use to deter and defeat our nation's enemies. Air show attendees are reminded that while the base is open to the public, there will still be security measures in place. Backpacks, coolers, camera bags and other similar large containers are pro-

hibited on the airfield although exceptions will be made for small purses and diaper bags, which will be searched upon arrival. Weapons such as firearms, large blades, pocket knives and blunt objects are also prohibited on installation.

Vehicles are subject to search and any weapons discovered will be confiscated and not returned. Cell phones and cameras will be permitted as well as strollers and wagons for small children; however, they are subject to search.

“Our Airmen and their families are the most important Airmen we have; they are special,” he said.

Since many of the command’s Airmen are stationed at isolated northern tier bases and working relatively out of sight to most Americans, Global Strikers tend to forget how special they are, said the chief.

Whether Global Strike Airmen are working outside at 30 degrees below zero, launching aircraft for global deterrence operations, or serving as support personnel — everyone is doing their part, Chief Johnson said.

“We are an elite, highly disciplined team,” he said.

One of the largest contributing factors to the success of the command, Chief Johnson said, was his relationship with its first commander, Lt. Gen. Frank Klotz, now retired.

Chief Johnson said General Klotz involved him in every program and every process, whether it traditionally involved a command chief or not, which gave him the status and the authority to be an effective senior leader.

“By his side, in every form, fashion and capacity, General Klotz allowed me to lead the enlisted men and women, and I’m very appreciative of that.”

Chief Johnson will serve in a joint role at U.S. Africa Command as Combatant Command Senior Enlisted Leader to Airmen, Soldiers, Sailors, Marines and civilians in his fourth assignment — a command’s top enlisted leader.

“Any opportunity that an Airman gets to represent this country — especially on a continent as great and vast as Africa — is an honor, and for me I’m privileged beyond belief to get to do so,” Chief Johnson said.

## Barksdale’s Citizens on Patrol

People may notice familiar faces checking I.D. cards and smoother traffic flow at the installation gates due to a new 2nd Security Forces Squadron program — “Citizens on Patrol.”

“Security forces received several requests for volunteers to assist the unit; however, the nature of what we do prohibits personnel from participating,” said Lt. Col. JonPaul Mickle, 2 SFS commander. “Most of our requests are for volunteerism that is more action oriented. To support that initiative, we created the Citizens on Patrol effort to help the community during rush-hour traffic in the mornings coming onto the installation.”

The new program provides wing and Air Force Global Strike Command Airmen the opportunity to integrate with other base agencies and involve themselves with law enforcement and base security.

“Citizens on Patrol allows other units to participate in something new,” said Staff Sgt. Matthew Jones, 2 SFS police services staff NCO. “This volunteer opportunity allows Airmen to step outside of their career field and give them a better understanding of the importance of base protection.”

The volunteers will help ensure Airmen’s safety while increasing the level of convenience for all.

“With the ongoing mission changes at

Barksdale and the growth of our population, we are experiencing predictable surges and delays at our installation gates in the morning,” Colonel Mickle said. “The math is simple — we either need more people at our existing gates, staggering shift reporting or new gates with additional lanes and more people. What the public will see is a balance of force protection with the need for access.”

Volunteers receive training on a variety of topics, including ID card checks, screening vehicles and emergency situations such as gate runners and improvised explosive device situations. Security forces members also instructed them on reinforcing seatbelts and prohibiting cell phones usage without hands-free capability.

Volunteers are required to work at least 10 hours at the gates performing in one-hour increments, Monday through Friday to help alleviate traffic backups.

“The 2nd Bomb Wing Commander, Col. Timothy Fay, will evaluate the support this program receives from the public and offer a B-52 incentive flight for the most hours volunteered if we can sustain our efforts,” Colonel Mickle said.

Personnel can volunteer for the Citizens on Patrol program by contacting the 2 SFS police services at (318) 456-3508. All volunteers must be active duty, guardsmen, reservists or civilian government employees.

# Barskdale celebrates National Nutrition Month

March is National Nutrition Month, and Barskdale, home of Air Force Global Strike Command, is doing its part in enforcing this year's theme, "Eat Right With Color."

Members from Barskdale's Health and Wellness Center are working to educate Airmen about the relationship between nutrition and health and how to apply the most current nutrition science to their daily lives.

"Eating right with color summarizes some key concepts that are found in the United States Department of Agriculture's most current, interactive food guidance system, MYPYRAMID," said Jennifer Coney, 2nd Medical Group registered dietitian. "The Web site, [www.mypyramid.gov](http://www.mypyramid.gov), is a great resource for all ages. It's based on the dietary guidelines for Americans."

The dietary guidelines describe a healthy diet emphasizing fruits, vegetables, whole grains and fat-free or low-fat milk and milk products. It also includes lean meats, poultry, fish, beans, eggs and nuts and is low in saturated fats, trans fats, cholesterol, salt and added sugars.

"Eating a variety of color from each group will provide an assortment of vitamins, minerals, antioxidants and much more," Coney said. "Antioxidants help protect the body from many diseases such as

cardiovascular, cancer and neurological. Sweet potatoes and carrots are great sources as well as some green vegetables, such as broccoli and spinach."

The MYPYRAMID also displays eating right with color by using a color coded pyramid to show the different food groups. The goal is to eat a variety from all food groups. Because the MYPYRAMID is interactive, it allows people to enter height, weight, physical activity and age to calculate their total caloric needs and well as how many servings they need from each food group.

The Barskdale HAWC will have information tables set up at the Red River Dining Facility, the commissary and the fitness center this month, and they encourage Airmen to stop by, grab some nutrition handouts, and sign up for a prize.


Coney urged Airmen to "be your own artist and let the color wheel guide your meal planning. You can start by filling half of your plate with colorful vegetables. Check your local market for seasonal produce."
