## Welcome home Warbirds

Monday afternoon marked an emotional return home for more than 200 Air Force Global Strike Command Airmen from the 5th Bomb Wing as family and friends anxiously waited in Dock 9 to show their support. Handmade posters and balloons from families were easily picked out in the large crowd as husbands, wives, and children reconnected and hugged after a long winter apart.

Nearly all the Airmen on the deployment returned home Monday but there are still a handful of maintenance and aircrew members left at Andersen Air Force Base, Guam, with an undetermined redeployment date, said Capt. Brian Jenkins, 5th BW installation deployment officer.

Airmen from the 69th Bomb Squadron deployed to Guam in November 2010 after replacing their sister-squadron in the 23rd Bomb Squadron five months earlier. The deployment for the 69th BS marked the first time the newly reactivated squadron has deployed since the Vietnam War. In total, the ten-month-long deployment for the wing also marked another milestone as it has never had back-to-back deployments to the same location. A total of six B-52H Stratofortresses were deployed to Guam in support of U.S. Pacific Command's Continuous Bomber Presence.

For some families, this was the first time being separated for a deployment. Airman 1st Class Curtis Bish, 5th Aircraft Maintenance

Squadron, and his wife Tiffny have two daughters, Coral and Emilie, ages four and three respectively, and Mrs. Bish said their girls handled the separation well.

"Saying goodbye was the hardest part of the deployment," said Mrs. Bish. "We do have two children and I know it was really hard for them as well. But we knew we'd get to talk to him every day."

In addition to email and other social media, many families used Skype to stay connected.

"We Skyped daily, sometimes twice a day, so we got to see each other every day," added Mrs. Bish. "That makes a big difference - just talking doesn't always help."

Even families who have several deployments under their belts relied upon Skype to help the time go faster. DeAnn Wege and her husband Chief Master Sgt. Robert Wege, 5th AMXS, also relied upon Skype for this deployment.

"This was our third deployment since we've been in Minot," said Mrs. Wege. "We have two teenagers and they seemed to handle it pretty well. We talked to him as much as we could. This year we got to use Skype a lot too so that really helped a lot. We even got to watch the Super Bowl together."

Deployed members of the 5th AMXS were well taken care of with the help of the squadron's key spouses group and squadron members pitching in to take care of each other.

"My husband's shop helped us out a lot," said Mrs. Bish. "While we were gone on vacation, they made sure to keep our driveway clear, so that helped a lot. I just want to thank ev-

eryone for making it a nice and easy deployment. It wasn't as stressful as it could have been."

Heather Weaver, wife of Staff Sgt. Travis Weaver, assistant NCO in charge of the 5th Maintenance Squadron, said this was the first deployment her husband had been on since they were married.

"It was pretty hard to say goodbye," said Mrs. Weaver. "He and I are equal with taking care of the kids and everything else."

"This is the first time he's left since we've been together. I am recently retired from the Air Force due to asthma. So it was especially rough to transition from being a working mom with help, to a single stay-at-home mom," she said.

"Skyping, emailing Travis, and being able to get on Facebook to talk to him helped a lot," added Mrs. Weaver. "While I was here in Minot, the key spouse program helped me out a lot as well. And, they are actually continuing to help me right now."

Senior leaders were on hand to greet returning Airmen as they walked off the plane. "We are very proud of our Airmen and all they accomplished during the Continuous Bomber Presence deployment," said Col. Julian Tolbert, 5th BW vice commander.

"Our Air Force Global Strike Command mission is to deter those who would do us ill and assure our allies-our expeditionary bomb squadron and associated maintainers did that mission while deployed in the U.S. Pacific Command theater by contributing to stability and security in the region during a period of heightened tensions."



# Kickin' it turbo style

Loud, upbeat and popular dance music plays for an hour straight. People are throwing punches and kicks as if they were getting attacked. Hitting the ground with their hands one second and springing into the air the next, these participants are moving fast enough to make anyone believe they were the Energizer Bunny®.

Such movements might seem sort of erratic and crazy, yet these actions are more choreographed and graceful than anything else.

This isn't a scene out of a fighting movie, or even a music video for that matter. This is what one would see and experience while participating in the Turbo Kickboxing class taught at the McAdoo Sports and Fitness Center here.

Air Force Global Strike Command Airmen and their families have the opportunity to take such a class twice a week, whether it is to meet a new work out partner, to achieve a serious fitness goal or for a break in their normal routine.

"Turbo kickboxing is a cardio kickboxing exercise program that focuses on cardiovascular improvement as well as muscle strength and endurance gains," said Sharon Brown, a certified turbo kickboxing instructor at the McAdoo Sports and Fitness Center. "It is different from regular kickboxing because it incorporates dance choreography with kickboxing moves to upbeat music."

Ms. Brown, who just recently gave birth to her third child, credits the class for helping her to lose the baby weight.

"It is said by the programs creator that people can burn anywhere from 500 to 1,000 calories in one hour," she said. "It all depends on how hard each individual works."

According to Ms. Brown, beginners usually have the hardest time with the choreography.

"Although the choreography is hard for beginners, that all changes when the class is attended on a regular basis," said Ms. Brown. "People tend to pick up on the cues and know what to expect, which allows them to work harder and get more out of the workout. For the regulars attending, the hardest part is focusing on technique."

While many might feel like this is a class for one type of person, Ms. Brown begs to differ.

"People of all sizes, ages and fitness levels attend this class," she said. "It is designed to accommodate all levels of fitness so one gains the most from what is put into the workout."

For those who feel intimidated by participating in this class for the first time, Ms. Brown offers some helpful advice.

"Don't get turned off by the choreography," she exclaimed. "It is intimidating at first, but beginners will definitely see improvements the more often they come to the class, and in turn will get a better workout. Some beginners also fear not being able to keep up, but that is not the focus for group exercise. The class has a format that the instructor teaches, but the participants can take it at any level."

So if going to the gym and doing the same old thing is getting a little monotonous, why not try out the turbo kickboxing class?

"There are so many benefits," said Ms. Brown. "Fitness and health improvements as well as personal relationships that are formed within the participants of the class are the most beneficial. This class has helped myself and many other people reach weight loss and fitness goals without the expense of gym fees or hiring a personal trainer."

Cheri Charboneau, a personal

trainer and group fitness director at the fitness center here, agrees with Ms. Brown in that the class has a lot to offer for those looking for something different.

"I really enjoy turbo kickboxing because there are so many layers to the choreography," she said. "Participants can keep the class low impact or they

can intensify the work by performing plyometrics. Instructors have the ability to teach the class a little bit each time so that each week, another layer of choreography can be added to keep it fun and entertaining."

Repeal of "Don't Ask, Don't Tell"

All of us will soon receive training on the repeal of the "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" law regarding homosexuality in the Armed Forces. There are two things you should know about the process of implementing the repeal, and there are two simple expectations that go along with the process.

First, the change will not be incremental, it will happen across the Department of Defense at the same time. Homosexual individuals who wish to serve in the United States military will be able to do so openly once the repeal is implemented.

Before this is possible, however, the Secretary of Defense and the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff will certify to the President of the United States that the Department of Defense is ready for implementation.

Second, before this certification occurs training will be required. Structured in three-tiers, the training emphasizes leadership, profes-

sionalism, discipline and respect. Tier one training includes policy makers, chaplains, lawyers and counselors. Commanders, senior NCOs and civilians will be trained in tier two. Every servicemember will eventually be trained under tier three, and the plan for completion of tier three training will be part of the certification briefing.

Expectation #1: Treat every Airman and civilian with respect and dignity. Each of us volunteered to serve; we can be proud of that. When the repeal becomes effective, homosexual members will be able to discuss their lifestyle openly, and they will be able to communicate with fellow servicemembers about their personal lives on a basis of mutual respect.

I expect all of us to behave with respect and decorum toward our fellow warriors. Each one of us is a leader, and the way we behave sets an

example for our wingmen.

Expectation #2: Fairness and equality for all is mandatory. Sexual orientation has no bearing on how personnel are treated, trained or assigned. Our most important product at Minot AFB is combat readiness - our warriors are ready, our families are ready, our units are cohesive and effective.

We cannot allow a failure of mutual respect or a lack of cultural discipline to affect our ability to perform the imperative combat mission that we are charged with every day and every night.

The message is clear: Our transition to repeal is the law of the land. We will follow the law.

If you're underage don't drink. If you're of age don't drink and drive. Never, ever leave your wingman.

Safety Corner: Driving during the thaw

Safety Corner: Spring into safety

Winter is finally coming to an end here at Air Force Global Strike Command's Minot Air Force Base. With spring-time drawing near, many people will start heading outdoors for activities including walks in the park, trips to local lakes, outdoor grilling and sports, among other activities.

While all of these activities are fun and enjoyable, they can also lead to potential yet preventable mishaps. For this season, the Air Force Safety Center designated its motto as "spring into safety," with the hope of eliminating or preventing spring-time mishaps. One of safety office's top priorities during this time of the year is motorcycle safety.

Statistically, April is the most dangerous month for motorcycle fatalities. Airmen in their mid-20s, who operate sport bikes, are at the greatest risk. Younger or inexperienced riders who choose not to follow simple rules such as wearing required personal protective equipment and failing to attend mandatory motorcycle safety training are also at a high risk. Another key factor in preventing motorcycle mishaps is to pay attention to the conditions of roads after winter months.

It's important for Airmen to simply know their challenges, limitations and the risks involved in our daily lives and activities. Mishaps can be avoided. It's human nature to believe that mishaps won't happen us. However, if we take a good look around, we never know what could happen around us.

It's essential to prepare before engaging in recreational activities while on off-duty time; whether it's a family outing or a fishing trip to the local pond, it's important to think before you act. Please believe me, if you fail to prepare, there will be a time when luck is not going to be on your side

and certain actions could result in injuries. A good preventative measure to take is to imagine the worst thing that could possibly go wrong in any situation, within reason. Then take the appropriate actions to ensure they don't.

The bottom line is we have to take care of our families, friends and co-workers as well as be good wingmen. I ask you to take a few moments to do some planning and consider hazards that could arise during any activity. # Minot Treaty Compliance Office, ready for foreign inspections

For Air Force Global Strike Command's Minot Treaty Compliance Office here, the prospect of having Russians visit Minot Air Force Base is very real. Nonetheless, the office's three-person team keeps bombers and missiles here ready for foreign country inspections.

Mr. Pat Travnicek, Mr. Dennis Mikula and Mr. Dave Bucknall make up the team responsible for ensuring the base complies with the specific treaty obligations that affect base activities and operations for the 5th Bomb Wing and the 91st Missile Wing.

"The primary treaty affecting Minot AFB is the New Strategic Arms Reduction Treaty, or New START," Mr. Travnicek said. "But the base has also had roles in the Chemical Weapons Convention and the Moscow and Open Skies Treaties as well."

Mr. Travnicek explained these treaties will more than likely require four, short-notice New START base inspections per year, but expects to receive two or three here locally.

New START was implemented on February 5, 2011, and calls for the United States and the Russian Federation to significantly reduce its strategic arms. According to the White House fact sheet on New START, it includes aggregate limits on deployed Minuteman III intercontinental ballistic missiles, deployed submarine-launched ballistic missiles and deployed heavy bombers equipped with nuclear armaments. At Minot AFB this includes the Minuteman III ICBM and the B-52H Stratofortress.

According to Mr. Travnicek, there are two types of inspection outlined in New START. A Type I inspection focuses on operational levels and the Type II inspection focuses on non-operational systems.

When Russian inspectors come here, they will be conducting a Type I inspection to confirm the accuracy of the declared data on the number and types of deployed ICBMs or heavy bombers the base has. The U.S. is scheduled to have seven years after the treaty entered into force date to meet the required numbers.

"From the time we're notified the inspectors are coming to Minot AFB, the U.S. has 24 hours to get the team to the base and begin the inspection process," he said. "To accomplish these short-notice inspections, the office depends upon the support of all squadrons to ensure success of the inspection."


He added the base support team composition changes depending upon whether it is a bomber or missile inspection. However, the squadrons that provide security, transportation, lodging, food services, and several others are always ready to go.

To prepare for the visits and comply with the reporting provisions of the treaty, Mr. Travnicek and his crew monitor reports from higher headquarters while sending their own reports through these channels. In an average year, the Minot Consolidated Command Post will submit more than 450 of these messages.

"There are 43 separate reports required under New START," he said. "In addition to receiving reports, we send out our own through the Command Post to report any movement of inspection items."

With the B-52 participating in world-wide operations, the tracking of their movements is a 24 hour-a-day responsibility. The reports go through AFGSC, the Arms Control Enterprise system at Langley AFB, Va., and finally the State Department's Nuclear Risk Reduction Center, where it will be reported to our treaty partners.

sile Wing commander, said the Minot AFB Treaty Compliance Office is invaluable in making sure inspections at Minot run smoothly.

"The Treaty Compliance Office here office provides us world class support whenever we are subject to a Missile

Base New START inspection," said Colonel Stoss. "The Russian inspectors under old START have been very impressed by their enthusiastic professionalism and hospitality and I expect nothing less under New START."

In addition to New START, the other treaties that affect Minot AFB are the Moscow and Open Skies Treaties and the Chemical Weapons Convention.

The Moscow Treaty was implemented May 29, 2002, and under the treaty, both the United States and Russia have agreed to reduce their strategic warheads by almost two-thirds by the end of 2012.

On January 1, 2002, the Open Skies Treaty was implemented, allowing signatory countries to fly over each others' countries to gather information about military forces and activities. The Minot AFB Treaty Compliance Office monitors the activities of all Open Skies missions that occur in the United States.

The Chemical Weapons Convention entered into force on April 29, 1997, and prohibits the research, development, production, stockpil-

ing, transfer, and the use of chemical weapons. Because of this convention, Minot AFB is susceptible to a challenge inspection, which would occur only if another country involved in the convention believes the United States is involved in the making of chemical weapons.

The team of experts at the Treaty Compliance Office here will continue to ensure each time the Russians visit the base for an inspection, that it is a successful and strengthens confidence between the U.S. and Russia.







# Deer gun season, winter aerial population survey summarized

North Dakota deer hunters took approximately 67,000 deer during the 2010 deer gun hunting season. Bill Jensen, big game biologist for the state Game and Fish Department, said overall hunter success was 64 percent.

Game and Fish made available 116,775 deer gun licenses in 2010, with more than 99 percent issued to hunters. Hunter success for antlered white-tailed deer was 68 percent, and antlerless whitetail was 63 percent.

Mule deer buck success was 68 percent, while mule deer doe hunters had a success rate of 70 percent.

Hunters with any-antlered or any-antlerless licenses almost exclusively harvest white-tailed deer. These buck and doe hunters each had a success rate of 64 percent.

Hunters drawing a muzzleloader license had a success rate of 46 percent, while young hunters during the youth season had a success rate of 55 percent.

Jensen said significant snow cover this past winter enabled the Game and Fish Department to complete aerial deer surveys in all monitoring blocks and long-term study areas. The surveys took

longer to complete than usual - all of January and February - due to poor weather conditions.

"Deer numbers in many parts of the state continue on a downward trend following three consecutive difficult winters," Jensen said. "Coupled with an aggressive harvest approach on antlerless deer in units with deer numbers above management goals, this has resulted in a reduction in the deer population in many, but not all, units."

Aerial observations in units south and west of the Missouri River indicate white-tailed deer numbers remain stable to increasing, and mule deer numbers are stable.

Large monitoring blocks in the northwest and north central portions of the state (3A1, 3A4, 2K1 and 2K2) have been stable to declining over the last three years, while the Cando area (2E) has shown declining deer numbers.

The Wing-Tuttle (2J1 and 2J2) and Dawson (2I) areas show stable to decreasing deer numbers over the last three years. Survey areas in the Red River Valley show



decreasing to stable deer numbers in unit 2A, while units 2B, 2C and 2D show a stable to slightly increasing deer population. Game and Fish staff will fly the annual mule deer survey in April after the snow melts.

The department is in the process of determining recommendations for licenses in

the 2011 deer proclamation. These recommendations will be discussed with the public at the upcoming Game and Fish advisory board meetings, scheduled for the week of April 18. The proclamation will be sent to the governor's office for approval in late April.

In addition to harvest

rates and aerial surveys, the department monitors a number of other population indices to determine license numbers, including deer-vehicle collision reports, depredation reports, hunter observations, input at advisory board meetings, and comments from the public, landowners and department field staff.

## PRAIRIE ADVENTURES

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service recently recognized a group of biologists for their piping plover population recovery efforts.

The Alkali Lakes Piping Plover Team includes Fish and Wildlife Service biologist Craig Hultberg, Audubon National Wildlife Refuge, and Eric Rosenquist, The Nature Conservancy (TNC) Central North Dakota Conservation Coordinator headquartered at the TNC's Cross Ranch near Hensler. Both feel the recognition extends far beyond the six team leaders. Much of the credit goes to the more than 150 private landowners who allow biologists to work on their land, said Rosenquist. Many are extremely interested in the work, he added.

Hultberg also extends credit to previous biologists involved with the project, as well as a multitude of seasonal staff in the field conducting predator control and other work to ensure nest success.

The Great Plains piping plover, a miniature killdeer-like shorebird, received threatened status under the Federal Endangered Species Act in 1985. Since then, agencies have been working on ways to stabilize and grow their numbers. Various agencies and conservation organizations began coordinating their efforts in the 1990s.

Plovers make small depressions on barren gravel alkaline lake shorelines for nests, laying up to four eggs.

Predator control - mammalian and avian - garners much of the recovery team's efforts, including putting wire cages over nests to keep gulls, hawks, and even crows away from extremely vulnerable nests. "Right now we believe gulls are a major predator," Rosenquist described.

A variety of mammals also like dining on piping plovers - everything from skunks, raccoons, badgers, and, yes, cats. "We've even had ground squirrels," Hultberg added.

While nest cages significantly improve nesting success, a big challenge is the getting the chicks to the fledgling stage - a hairy 17- or 18-day stretch when the cotton ball on toothpick-like chicks are as equally at peril as they are in the nest.

That's where adequate habitat is so critical, Hultberg said. Vegetation needs to be low enough so mammalian predators can't sneak up on unsuspecting chicks, yet adequate enough so they can hide when necessary. Nearby trees also spell danger when hawks and crows use them as perches to eye their prey. Studies show cages help nest success, Hultberg said, but now the challenge biologists face is improving fledgling rates so chicks survive long enough to be able to fly.

"We can't be putting nest cages on forever," Rosenquist said. Cages are a short-term solution. Now biologists are analyzing their efforts to determine what long-term solutions can be.

Adequate habitat will play a large part in determining that solution. Even though their nesting habitat is still similar to what it has been for generations, land use changes can play a role in nesting success. For example, working with landowners to remove rock or junk piles harboring predators is one way to improve nesting and fledgling success.

North Dakota's Coteau region is critical to the future of piping plovers. While the recovery team has already made great strides, "we've still got a lot to learn," Hultberg said. Nevertheless, it's nice to be recognized for the work that's already been accomplished.

## Spring turkey season opens April 9, licenses remain

North Dakota's spring turkey season opens Saturday, April 9 and continues through May 15. Hunters are reminded a 2011-12 hunting license is required, as last year's 2010-11 licenses expired March 31. In addition to the spring turkey license, hunters must have a fishing, hunting and furbearer certificate, and a general game and habitat license. Also, hunters ages 16 and older must possess a small game license, or combination license.

Hunters who do not have a spring turkey license for the 2011 season can still apply in Bowman (unit 06), Mountrail (unit 31), Slope (unit 44) or Stark (unit 45) counties. Only those hunters who do not have a license are eligible to apply. These first-come, first-served licenses are available online at the North Dakota Game and Fish Department's website, [gf.nd.gov](http://gf.nd.gov), or call (701) 328-6300 to request an application. Only North Dakota residents are eligible to apply.

## Sharp-tailed grouse observation blinds to open

Several national wildlife refuges and a state wildlife management area will offer sharp-tailed grouse observation blinds for public use this spring. The blinds are popular with wildlife photographers and others interested in watching the spring courtship rituals of sharp-tailed grouse.

Grouse blinds typically receive widespread interest and are available by reservation only. Those locations offering blinds usually start taking reservations for late March or early April, weather permitting. Peak grouse dancing activity usually occurs from mid-April into early May.

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department has an observation blind at Lonetree Wildlife Management Area southwest of Harvey. Call (701) 324-2211 for reservations.

# Critical self-assessment puts AFGSC on the right path

**BARKSDALE AIR FORCE BASE, La. (AFNS)** - With the Air Force conducting operations on multiple fronts across the globe and facing shrinking resources, Air Force Global Strike Command Airmen are focusing on finding smarter ways to accomplish the mission.

"(The Analyses, Assessments and Lessons Learned Directorate) is the entity that is aimed at helping the command, at all levels, to not have to re-learn anything," said Lt. Col. Dwayne Hall, the lessons learned division chief.

"If people keep walking into the same wall, we're going to keep experiencing the same pain each time."

The directorate, known as A9, helps the commander, headquarters staff and commanders at the command's six wings improve efficiency and effectiveness.

One of the biggest advantages A9 has, according to Colonel Hall, is the ability to send staff members out to the wings to talk face-to-face with the people experiencing a problem or trying to resolve an issue.

"Where we really 'make our money' in A9 is when we sit down with people and interview them," he said.

Colonel Hall said once an issue is identified, the staff calls in expertise from across the command.

"We take issues that the wings are struggling with on a daily basis and bring them back to the staff. Then we can help create opportunities for change and help them focus their efforts," Colonel Hall said. "We can focus on any issue that someone feels is important."

"We can't afford to stay fat, dumb and happy," he said. "We should all be concerned with capturing the experiences of Airmen and

incorporating the best ideas at all levels. Our focus is to help produce a lean, effective combat capability."

One way the directorate does this is by focusing on areas important to the command.

"We attempt to 'marry up' with the efforts that are consuming time and effort at the headquarters, numbered Air Forces and wings," Colonel Hall said.

In keeping with the command's value of "critical self assessment," the analyses and assessments division looks at everything from current and future weapons systems to force structure within the command, to ensure that leaders have the best information possible when making decisions, the colonel said.

"Our analyses and assessments folks can help tell a more detailed story and help staff action officers convey a more detailed solution/problem set," he said.

"In essence, our guys take us beyond the anecdotal answer to the scientific, analytical answer."

Those detailed analyses and recommendations from lessons learned have led to a number of successes since the standup of the command, including recommending a bomber generation training course to educate individuals about the aircraft generation process, he said.

This training course clarified the role played by Task Force 204 for squadron commanders and their planning personnel.

Another lessons learned success was the current development of more comprehensive and telling metrics to improve ICBM maintenance processes to better predict system sustainment and health-of-force concerns, he said.

"The basis for our existence is to focus critical resources, people and missions on the right path," Colonel Hall said.







## Fresh Mint & Garlic Marinated Grilled Lamb Loin Chops

- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 shallot, minced
- 1/2 bunch parsley leaves, chopped
- 1/2 bunch mint leaves, chopped
- 1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil
- 2 tablespoons red wine vinegar
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1 teaspoon black pepper
- 8 lamb loin chops

In bowl, add garlic, shallot, herbs, olive oil, vinegar, salt and pepper. Whisk to combine. Place lamb chops into a bowl and add 3/4 cup of marinade (reserve remaining for sauce). Mix to coat thoroughly. Cover and refrigerate for at least 1 hour. Preheat grill to medium-high heat. Grill lamb to desired temperature (medium-rare is recommended). Remove from heat and allow the lamb chops to rest for 5 minutes. Drizzle chops with the reserved mint and garlic sauce.

# NW Art Center lecture highlights recycling

ND Department of Health Environmental Scientist Christy Smith will present "Preventing and Reducing Waste, Recycling 101, and Buying Recycled Products" on the Northwest Art Center Lecture Series Wednesday, April 20, 2011 at 7:00 p.m. in the Aleshire Theater, Minot State University.

The lecture coincides with international activities on environmental awareness that lead to the annual observance of Earth Day April 22.

"In North Dakota, each person generates over five pounds of waste per day," said Smith. "Preventing and reducing waste, recycling, and

buying recycled products are everyone's responsibility."

Smith will explain community waste-reduction incentives such as "Pay-As-You-Throw," as well as strategies to help individual consumers reduce waste.

Smith works primarily with the Pollution Prevention (P2) program, solid waste education, and recycling activities at the ND Department of Health. Before joining the department in 2008, Smith earned her M.S. and B.S. degrees from Colorado State University, and worked with a wide variety of environmental remediation projects in northern California.

## AF officials issue guidelines for green fleece

WRIGHT-PATTERSON AIR FORCE BASE, Ohio - Additional new guidance has just been released from the office of Manpower, Personnel and Services, or AF/A1, at the Pentagon regarding wear of the authorized sage-green fleece outer garment.

According to a message issued by AF/A1, "The sage-green fleece jacket, commonly known as Generation III or Gen III, was the original version authorized for wear. Due to limited availability at Army Air Force Exchange Service Military Clothing Stores and through the Defense Supply Center Philadelphia, some units purchased and issued other versions."

The message continues by explaining these other versions may be worn as long as they meet the configuration requirements for name tapes and rank. Requirements for wear are the following:

- A Velcro ABU print last-name tape with dark-blue block lettering, centered between the zipper and sleeve seam on the wearer's right chest
- A Velcro ABU print U.S. Air Force tape with dark-blue block lettering, adjacent to the name tape and centered between the zipper and sleeve seam on the wearer's left chest
- A Velcro subdued cloth rank with a solid sage-green background, flush and centered above the last-name tape on the wearer's right chest.
- Fleece must remain zipped no lower than halfway

between the name tape and the collar

- The collar must be folded over and resting on the shoulder, chest and back when the zipper is not completely zipped
- The bottom length of the fleece must be as close to length of ABU top as possible
- Sleeves must be worn down at all times
- Fleece must be kept in a neat, serviceable and professional appearance at all times
- The sage-green fleece may only be worn over the ABU top, and is not authorized to be worn solely over a T-shirt, thermal underwear or similar undergarments, when worn as an outer garment

Items authorized for wear with the fleece include black or sage-green leather, suede or knit gloves; black or sage-green watch caps; black scarves that are tucked in; and black ear muffs.

Commanders also have the authority to allow wear of the fleece indoors if mission needs require it. According to AF/A1 officials, the number one concern is the health and well being of Airmen.

## National Guard forces ready for quick response

WAHPETON, N.D. - As 2011 flood operations hit full-swing this week, the North Dakota National Guard is on standby for potential emergencies in Richland County. Two eight-member quick response force, or QRF, teams are based out of the Wahpeton Armed Forces Reserve Center and on call 24 hours a day to respond.

Sgt. 1st Class Jon Benedict, of Wahpeton, is the noncommissioned officer in charge of one group. He said both teams are on from 7:30 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. and on-call during the evening since it's rare to get calls then. Once people wake up and realize the water has encroached quickly overnight is when the calls come in, he says, speaking from the experience of three years of flood-fighting experience in the area.

The Soldiers are members of the 188th Engineer Battalion, North Dakota Army National Guard, which is on an alert for potential deployment this year.

Two five-ton dump trucks are filled with sandbags and faced out, ready to roll should a call come in. The team also has Humvees packed with ropes, chains, waders and life vests.

"We're prepared to do pretty much anything - traffic control points, evacuation, distributing sandbags," Benedict said.


