Hope for devastated Minot

A press conference held at city hall here June 26 offered a shred of good news for those residents, Airmen, and family members impacted by Minot's record-shattering floods during the month of June.

The mayor announced that the Souris River measured at 1561.72 feet late in the evening of June 25 and had receded to 1561.57 feet as of 3 p.m., June 26.

Minot Mayor Curt Zimbelman cautiously stated, "We feel the river has probably crested." Officials stated that the National Weather Service would not officially pronounce the river as being crested for another few days.

The mayor said that Broadway will remain closed for at least one more week to allow for uninterrupted building of the secondary dike system. Only emergency vehicles will be allowed through.

North Dakota Governor Jack Dalrymple said two disaster recovery centers are scheduled to open June 27, operating between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. One location is the Minot City Auditorium; the second location is the Minot State University Student Center.

Impacted residents needing to register for assistance do not need to visit a center. Displaced persons can register by calling 1-800-621-3362 or by visiting the website www.disaster-assistance.gov.

Air Force Global Strike Command Airmen, Minot city officials, the National Guard, and the Corps of Engineers here fought the worst flood in this city's history.

Maj. Gen. David Sprynczynatyk, the North Dakota National Guard adjutant general, said he was very happy with the assistance the National Guard has been receiving from the Airmen at Minot Air Force Base.

"We have been working very closely with the air force base," said the general. "That unified effort has really paid off. I greatly appreciate the contribution from Minot AFB. We continue to respond to quick reaction force needs, supporting the city and the Army Corps of Engineers. We continue to provide security, traffic control, aerial evacuations, and placement of one-ton sandbags. These are all ongoing things."

Minot's boil water order is still in effect and will be until further notice.

This boil water order also applies to Minot AFB.

Jason Sorenson, the Minot Water Treatment Plant superintendent, said the breach that possibly caused water contamination has been fixed.

"The plant continues to put out clean water," he said. "Please understand it takes time for something that happened at the plant to work its way out of the system."

Mr. Sorenson reinforced the fact that everyone at the plant is doing the best they can and just want to make sure they can provide the city and surrounding areas with water for sanitation, at the very least.



Emergency shelter provides for those in need

Thousands had to evacuate the city soon after sirens were heard in Minot June 22, which prompted base leadership to begin operations in support of base personnel affected by the flooding situation.

Among one of the actions taken by Air Force Global Strike Command's Minot AFB was the offering of emergency shelter and facility services to all displaced DoD personnel.

"In our emergency shelter we have opened our doors to retirees, active duty, DoD civilians and contractors and their families," said Cindy Whitesell, 5th Force Support Squadron chief of the Airman and Family Readiness Center. "We have also offered an RV overflow parking area for those who would like to use it."

The A&FRC has kept track of the number of displaced personnel who are utilizing the emergency shelter and presently, a total of 63 people are there, including 12 families, with more expected to arrive each day. Ms. Whitesell explained the A&FRC has continually been working together with emergency shelter personnel to provide supplies and food to the families and there has been a tremendous amount of support received from the base community.

Ruby Hood, 5th Operations Support Squadron facility manager, said the shelter offers a variety of things for the displaced families includ-

ing bedrooms, a laundry facility, TV entertainment area, movie room, children's play area, café, computer room, free Wi-Fi and a kitchen full of a variety of food and snacks.

"Families are free to utilize the kitchen area," said Ms. Hood. "We've gotten a lot of food donated to us and more keeps coming every day."

Maj. William Byers, 5th OSS assistant director of operations, said there is designated transportation for families to the Dakota Inn Dining Facility where they can receive hot meals. The major said since the beginning, the standup of operations at the emergency shelter have been a lot easier due to the tremendous support the wing has provided.

"We have had excellent volunteer support all around," said Major Byers. "They've helped us with anything from bring supplies up here, cleaning, organizing rooms and identifying needs for families."

Stephanie Ballard, 5th Aircraft Maintenance Squadron key spouse mentor, has been in charge of organizing food donations at the shelter and said she's proud of the network of support the key spouses have received from people on base everywhere.

"Everything is working out great because the message is getting out about the importance of helping out families at this shelter," said Mrs. Ballard. "I hear people here talk about how grateful and appreciative they are of our help. We've really tried to go above and beyond in providing for the families needs."

Sarah Eliason, whose father is a DoD employee here, said she was thankful the base offered shelter because she has three children and when the order came down to evacuate immediately, she wasn't going over leaps and bounds to find a place to stay.

"It was difficult to have to leave home but I try to make the best of what I can get," said Mrs. Eliason. "Right now my kids are still adjust-

ing from being away from home, but overall they've been doing great. I try to make things as familiar as they were before for them."

Mrs. Eliason said she couldn't really have asked for more and expressed the services she has had at the shelter has been excellent.

"My children are the most important thing to me and I appreciate all the help we have received," said Mrs. Eliason.

Water conservation order

Water consumption must be curtailed by all residents of Minot AFB. The bases water supply from the Minot Treatment Facility was shut off mid day on Monday, June 27 due to multiple breaks in the distribution system throughout the valley. Please limit use of water to drinking and hygiene only.

IMMEDIATELY: Stop all car washing, outside garden hose use, do not irrigate flowers, lawns etc., shut off water while lathering soaps and shampoos, use conservative rations when preparing food and drinking, wash dishes by hand do not let water run while rinsing, turn off ice makers, only run clothes washer when

more than ½ full, compost vegetable food waste instead of using garbage disposal, Wash your fruits and vegetables in a pan of water instead of running water from the tap.

Don't use running water to thaw food. Defrost food in the refrigerator for water efficiency and food safety. Keep a bucket in the shower to catch water as it warms up or runs. Use this water to flush toilets or water plants.

All family members with friends and family outside the local area that can go for an extended stay are encouraged to assist in conserving as much water as possible for those that are unable.

ND issues boil order effective immediately

The State of North Dakota has issued a boil order effective immediately because untreated water has entered the Minot water system, which affects Minot AFB.

It is unknown if the water is contaminated. Preventive measures need to be put into place until the quality of the water is verified.

- Do NOT use tap water to wash dishes, brush your teeth, wash and prepare food and formula or make ice.
- Water should be boiled or treated before use. Drink only bottled, boiled or treated water until the water supply is tested and found safe.
- Boiling water kills harmful bacteria and parasites. Bringing water to a rolling boil for one minute will kill

most organisms.

- Water may be treated with chlorine or iodine tablets, or by mixing six drops (1/8 teaspoon) of unscented ordinary household chlorine bleach (5.25% sodium hypochlorite) per gallon of water. Mix the solution thoroughly, and let stand for about 30 minutes. However, this treatment will not kill parasitic organisms.

- Containers for water should be rinsed with a bleach solution before reusing them.

- Do not rely on untested devices for decontaminating water. Water from home distillers may be used.

- This will be in effect for at least 24 hours, quite possibly longer, until the quality of the water is verified.

- For hand washing, boiled or bottled water and/or alcohol-based hand sanitizer should be used.

No pencil eraser for social media

LUKE AIR FORCE BASE, Ariz. (AFNS) - In February 2010, Pentagon officials authorized using social networks on unclassified military computers. They believe the benefits of social media outweigh security concerns.

However, operational security has always been a military constant and that has not diminished with the advent of social media. If anything, OPSEC has become more important because of what we can say and where we can say it.

Loose lips and unchecked gossip on social media sites can bring down social media pages and have the potential to harm military operations and missions, as Sailors and Marines serving aboard the amphibious assault ship Bataan learned in May 2011. Escalating arguments and "the airing of dirty laundry" led Fleet Forces Command to shut down the ship's official Facebook page, citing OPSEC concerns.

"Numerous cases regarding OPSEC violations have arisen on several sites," said a spokesperson for the Bataan Amphibious Ready Group.

"This makes it very difficult to support a social networking site, while keeping the mission clear and our Sailors safe. Once the command has conducted a thorough review, the page will be brought back online, but the ability for guests to post comments will be removed in the short term."

It is a privilege to be able to use social media sites from military computers, but with that privilege comes responsibility.

"Enjoy using social media as a means to keep in touch with loved ones and friends, especially while deployed, but always be mindful to protect the mission and your own personal critical information when posting," said Lt. Col. Jeffrey McMillen, 944th Fighter Wing OPSEC program manager.


As in the past, every military member and civilian employee is responsible for OPSEC.

"When tempers flare, it is best to disengage from public forums and Internet communication," Colonel McMillen said. "Cool heads are better than angry ones at protecting critical information, as well as avoiding embarrassment. Remember, there's no such thing as a Number 2 pencil eraser for the Internet. It's like publishing a book: Once it's out there, it's out there."

The idea that terrorists, foreign governments or spies might be looking for secrets from Facebook pages might seem a bit far-fetched, but the enemy is watching.

Ultimately, social media is just another form of communication where OPSEC rules must be followed. These same rules have been around for decades. The only thing that has changed is the technology and the speed of communication.

FAQ flood related legal assistance

The material below represents general legal principles. The law is continually changing; although the information in the handout is current, some provisions here may have changed. It is always best to consult an attorney about legal rights and responsibilities regarding personal cases.

1. Do I have to pay rent if I was in the mandatory evacuation zone? If not, for how long?

Generally speaking, you should not have to pay rent for the proportionate time you were unable to occupy the premises. Once the mandatory evacuation order is lifted, you may also not be liable to pay for that portion of time the property was uninhabitable (e.g., the property flooded and needs to be repaired).

a. What if I was not in the mandatory evacuation zone, but I evacuated anyway?

Generally, if you were not required to leave, but you did so anyway, you will have to continue to pay rent. However, if the property was uninhabitable for a period of time, you should not have to pay for the portion of time it was uninhabitable.

2. Do I have to pay my mortgage if I was in the mandatory evacuation zone?

Generally, yes. You will have to continue to pay your mortgage. You should check with your mortgage company and homeowners insurance company to see if they provide any assistance or accommodation. For instance, your mortgage company may voluntarily extend a grace period to you for paying the mortgage. Keep in mind, such accommodation is probably not required. Your homeowner's insurance policy, while not covering flood damage, may provide some displacement allowance. Also, check with FEMA, State, and local authorities to see if you qualify for rental payments for temporary housing.

3. Can I cancel my lease if my apartment was in the evacuation zone? If so, under what conditions?

Under North Dakota law, a lease terminates when the property is destroyed. See NDCC § 47-16-14, para. 4. A lessee may also terminate a lease if he has put the Landlord on notice of necessary repairs and after a reasonable period of time the Landlord fails to fix the problem. NDCC § 47-16-17, para. 2

4. Can I cancel my mortgage if my property was in the mandatory evacuation area?

More than likely no.

a. What if it's a total loss and I can no longer live there due to the flood?

You should contact your mortgage and insurance companies. Generally speaking, you still cannot cancel the mortgage, but they may be able to help you in other ways.

5. Do I have to pay utilities if I lived in the mandatory evacuation zone? If so, how much?

Generally, you should not be responsible for utilities that were not supplied to your home. You also should not have to pay if you did not consume utilities. However, you are still responsible for utilities supplied prior to the flood. Check with your utility supplier and local authorities on taxes, assessment and levies during the period of mandatory evacuation. In any event, you should notify your utilities company of your situa-

tion as soon as possible.

a. Does it matter if I own vs. rent the residence?

Generally, the answers to utilities apply whether you rent or own your home.

6. I have inbound orders to Minot AFB and have already signed a contract to purchase a home, but my orders have been cancelled/delayed, what can I do?

Contact your realtor as soon as possible and inform them of your situation. You may be able to terminate the contract, but you may lose any earnest money you paid. However, your realtor or attorney may be able to assist you in negotiating a return of your earnest money, given the circumstances. Each situation will depend on the contract you signed and the facts that apply.

7. I rent my home, but want to take in displaced friends. My lease restricts how long and how many visitors I can have. Does the flood or federal declaration change that?

Probably not. You should review your lease before you take in displaced persons. If it places restrictions on how many or how long additional people can stay with you, you should contact your landlord to discuss. If your landlord refuses to accommodate you, you must comply with the lease. If the landlord agrees to permit your guest to stay, you should document this and any additional terms, to include duration, change in rent or security deposit, in writing with the landlord. Keep in mind, the landlord may place additional restrictions on you (e.g., require additional rent or security deposit, specific number of guest and/or duration).

It is your choice whether to accept these additional restrictions and have your guest stay, or decide not to have your guest stay and abide by the current terms of the lease. However, you can attempt to negotiate with the landlord over these new and additional terms.

8. I have flood insurance, how do I file a claim?

Contact the agent that sold you the policy and tell them you want to file a claim. When safe to do so, consider documenting the loss you incurred by videotaping or photographing the property. Gather receipts for purchases or consider other ways to document the value of the property lost or damaged.

9. I do not have flood insurance and my home was damaged by the flood:

a. Can I file a claim with the Air Force?

Not for losses incurred off-base.

b. Can I file a claim with my insurance company?

Possibly, but they likely will not pay for losses due to the flood. However, they may provide assistance in other ways (e.g., displacement expenses, losses incurred as a result of damage not directly caused by the flood such as spoiled food due to power loss). Contact your agent for details.

c. Does it matter if I rent my home or own it?

It could make a difference if you have renters insurance. Renter's insurance may cover you for losses due to a flood. You should contact your insurance company if you have renter's insurance.

10. What does the federal disaster declaration mean to me?

Can I get assistance from FEMA? If so, how?

Please visit the FEMA web site at www.fema.gov for information related to FEMA and the federal disaster declaration. To get assistance from FEMA you must first register with them. According to their web site you can register by calling 800-621-FEMA (3362) or TTY 800-462-7585. The toll-free line will be in operation from 6 a.m. to 12 a.m. (CDT) until further notice. Registration can be accomplished anytime at:

11. The flood is over. My Landlord is telling me he's repaired the place, but I don't think it's good enough for me to move back in. What can I do?

Consider asking your Landlord to have the City inspect the premises to make sure it is safe and habitable for you to live there. Until such approval is given, generally speaking, you are not obligated to live there or pay rent. See the answer to FAQ 1 above. Consider contacting an attorney for assistance.

12. Pets - I took in a foster pet and it has damaged my property; what can I do?

Generally speaking, you should contact the owner. If you received the pet from a shelter, contact the shelter for assistance. If you cannot get assistance from the owner or shelter, but you have homeowner's insurance, also consider notifying them.

13. I was in the mandatory evacuation zone; I am now staying in a hotel. I can't afford to pay my rent or mortgage and the hotel bill. What can I do?

As noted above, your rent may be temporarily abated for that portion of time you are unable to live in the home. If you own, you should contact FEMA, State and local authorities to see if they can provide you with rental assistance. Also consider contacting your homeowner's insurance company to see if they provide any displacement assistance. If you cannot get assistance from any of these sources, you should contact your mortgage company to see if they will give you a grace period for payment of the mortgage (keep in mind, such would be voluntary on their part and interest may continue to accrue).

14. My car was flooded; will my auto insurance cover that?

Maybe. Check with your auto insurance policy and your agent.

15. I sent my children to my parents/relatives/friends because of the flood. Are there any legal issues I should be thinking about or doing related to that?

Yes; you should consider granting authority to whomever your children are staying to make decisions and give permissions for your children. This is called In Loco Parentis and the form can be obtained from the Base Legal Office. Also consider notifying Tricare that your children are staying elsewhere temporarily.

16. I volunteered during the flood and got hurt. What should I do?

a. AD and dependants - report this to the MTF and commander. They may be able to recover the expense of

your care from the responsible party.

b. Civilians w/ insurance - notify your insurance company.

c. Civilians w/o insurance - notify the local authorities or the volunteer organization you worked for.

17. I had rent-to-own property that was damaged/lost because of the flood. What can/should I do?

First, check your rental agreement to see what the terms are. Contact the company you rented from and inform them of the loss. If you have renter's or homeowner's insurance, consider filing a claim with them. You should also register with FEMA, as noted above.

18. I think my property was looted; what should I do?

Notify the police and your insurance company.

19. I paid for services in advance (childcare, phone, internet, cable, etc.) and now I can't use the service because I was in the mandatory evacuation zone. What should I do?

Notify the service provider of your situation as soon as possible. They may give you a deferral or permit you terminate the agreement. If you cannot reach an agreement about what to do, consider seeing a Legal Assistance Attorney. Generally speaking, if you cannot receive the service because of the flood, you should be able to at least get a deferral of service until you can reasonably get service again.

20. I had property that was left at a business in the mandatory evacuation zone. If it's damaged because of the flood, what can I do?

Contact the business as soon as possible to see if your property was damaged. If it was, generally speaking the business should be responsible for your loss.

21. I've lost property because of the flood, but I financed the purchase and still owe money on it. Must I pay?

Generally speaking, yes, you still must pay the debt owed. However, depending on what the property is and how it was lost, you may be able to either get assistance in paying for the loss through insurance or governmental assistance.

22. The place where I worked was in the flood zone. My employer is telling me I'm laid off because of the flood. What can I do?

Generally, unless you have an employment contract, you are laid off. You may be able to file for unemployment insurance. You can find out more information about unemployment insurance and file a claim for benefits at this web site: <http://www.jobsnd.com/unemployment-for-individuals/ui-ice>

a. He's also telling me he can't pay me for work I've done. What should I do?

Contact an attorney for assistance. Generally speaking, the employer is obligated to pay you for work performed.





Fishing opportunities plentiful

Families looking to enjoy an outdoor outing over the Fourth of July weekend need to look no further than a local fishery.

Greg Power, North Dakota Game and Fish Department fisheries chief, said high water levels across much of the state are a benefit to most lakes and fish populations.

"Fishing opportunities are abundant on a statewide level," Power said.

"The fish populations are high in many areas, and the opportunity is

there for people to catch fish. Never has the state had so many different water bodies to fish."

However, Power emphasizes that anglers should check ahead regarding the status of boat ramps.

"Access roads have been an issue in some areas and some ramps are inundated in a few locales," Power added. "However, shoreline fishing opportunities are still abundant statewide."


Although most boating access sites on the Missouri River are currently under-

water, most ramps on Lake Sakakawea and Oahe are still functional.

Likewise, most ramps at Devils Lake are now fully operational.

"Good fish populations should equate to good fishing," Power said, "and we encourage the public to participate."

Fluffy the Wild Kitty is an efficient predator – and carries its share of potential infections, as well.

Wild, or feral, cats are especially efficient at killing small songbirds, described N.D. Game and Fish Department furbearer biologist Stephanie Tucker. In addition, feral cats can carry a variety of potential infections and diseases, Tucker said.

Adult wild cats rarely acclimate to humans and an indoor living environment, she added, and it's extremely difficult for them to adapt to life as a domestic feline.

However, not everyone considers feral cats efficient predators. Several organizations and cities such as Berkeley, Cal., advocate TNR – trap, neuter and return – as effective feral cat colony management and dispute their efficiency as predators.

Elsewhere, states such as Wyoming define stray cats as a predatory animal and they can be dispatched without any license requirements.

On the wild side, raccoons and skunks are North Dakota's top two rabies vectors. Because of their disease potential, it's illegal to transplant or move them, Tucker said.

Red foxes are the most efficient waterfowl and upland bird nest predators, Tucker said. Coyotes are less likely to take eggs but will prey on adult birds if an opportunity arises.

Mink, raccoons, and skunks also rank among top ground nest predators. Mink are especially hard on waterfowl nests located near water because they focus on wetlands and adjacent areas, Tucker said.

In general, predators such as foxes, coyotes, mink, raccoons, and skunks are opportunistic – if it's easy to catch and eat or

readily available, they'll take advantage of the situation.

Bigger predators such as mink, raccoons, skunks or foxes aren't the only critters to feast on ground nests and eggs, Tucker described. Others predators include avian species such as gulls and crows.

Even small mammals can be predators: The likes of ground squirrels – the brownish Richardson's ground squirrels, aka

gopher – won't pass up a duck egg if it's readily available.

If predators such as skunks, raccoons or feral cats

become a problem, never handle or touch wild animals or feral cats because they can bite or scratch, potentially resulting in infections, Tucker advised.

If dealing with a problem feral cat or critter like a raccoon or skunk, Tucker recommends humanely dispatching the animal rather than live trapping it and moving it elsewhere, which simply transfers the problem to another area.

Tucker feels it's more humane to dispatch the animal rather than release it elsewhere because many predators, whether small predators such as raccoons or skunks or large ones like mountain lions, are territorial.

For example, other than humans, a mountain lion's greatest death threat is from another mountain lion, she said.

Raccoons – even wolves – face a similar situation. Someone releasing a live-trapped, transplanted raccoon likely moved it into another raccoon's territory.

The transplanted animal is susceptible to death from another predator – through injuries from fighting, for example – or disease.

Fireworks prohibited on wildlife management areas

Fourth of July is a time for celebration, with many families getting together to enjoy a holiday weekend of fun-filled activities often culminating in a fireworks display. With that in mind, the North Dakota Game and Fish Department reminds citizens that lighting fireworks on state wildlife management areas is prohibited.

Wildlife management areas are a popular destination for many, according to Jeb Williams, wildlife resource management supervisor. "We encourage people to get out and use our public lands, and to look at the habitat and watch for the wildlife," Williams said.

The primary objective of a wildlife management area is to enhance wildlife production, provide hunting and fishing opportunities, and offer other outdoor recreational and educational uses. Only activities that would not disrupt the intentions of how these areas are managed are encouraged, and a fireworks display is not compatible.

Excessive noise and commotion that come with fireworks disturbs wildlife, and their explosive nature is a potential source of wildfires. Chances of a wildfire developing are greatly enhanced when explosives, such as fireworks, come in contact with tall grasses in rural areas.

A complete list of the WMA regulations is available on the Game and Fish website, gf.nd.gov.

Some of the regulations include:

- Unless otherwise designated, the use of motorized vehicles is restricted to constructed roads, well-worn trails, and parking areas normally used for passenger cars.
- Watercraft cannot be left unattended unless it is used on a daily basis.
- Littering or the disposal of waste material is prohibited, except in garbage containers where provided.
- Property may not be removed without a permit from the Game and Fish Department.
- Commercial enterprise, including guiding, is prohibited except by lease or permit from the Game and Fish Department.
- Camping for longer than 10 consecutive days is prohibited.
- Group activities involving more than 25 people require a permit issued by the Game and Fish Department.
- Training of bird and gun dogs is prohibited April 1 through Aug. 15.
- Glass containers are prohibited.
- Fireworks, model rocket engines, or combustible or explosive materials are prohibited.
- Baiting wildlife for any purpose is prohibited.

Game and Fish summarizes 2010 pheasant season

More pheasant hunters in the field in 2010 didn't correlate to an increase in roosters in the bag.

Last fall's pheasant harvest was 552,800, down from 651,700 in 2009. The number of hunters increased 4 percent to 91,900. The number of resident hunters was up 3 percent to 61,100, while nonresident pheasant hunter numbers increased 7 percent to 30,800. Birds bagged per hunter decreased from 7.4 to 6.0, and each hunter spent an average of 4.9 days afield.

Counties with the highest percentage of pheasants taken by resident hunters were Hettinger, 7.3; Burleigh, 6.1; McLean, 6.0; Stark, 5.2; and Morton, 4.5. Top counties for nonresident hunters were Hettinger, 23.9 percent; Bowman, 6.2; McIntosh, 5.1; Dickey, 5.0; and Divide, 4.4.

Annual pheasant season statistics are determined by a mail survey of resident and nonresident hunters.

New state record Buffalo caught

Keith Huschka's catch on June 19 is the first entry on North Dakota's list of state record fish in 2011. The Dickinson angler caught a 54-pound buffalo from the Heart River in the tail waters of Heart Butte Dam.

The 42-inch fish broke the old record of 51 pounds, 4 ounces taken by Joshua Bartz of Bismarck from the Missouri River in 2009.

Lake Darling to re-open to boat fishing

Effective this Friday, July 1 at 5 am, Lake Darling will re-open to boat fishing. Access on the lake is restricted only to the area from Lake Darling Dam to Grano Crossing. Boaters are advised to use extreme caution while navigating as the water is still very high and strong currents exist in some portions of the lake. Presently, the only boat ramp available to launch a boat is the Spillway boat ramp located adjacent to Lake Darling Dam. Base water possibly contaminated

Many Air Force Global Strike Command Airmen and their families flooded the commissary here when the boil water order was put into effect for the city of Minot, which includes the air force base, June 25. A boil water order was issued to the city of Minot in response to a possible contamination incident at the Minot Water Treatment Plant.

Jason Sorenson, the Minot Water Treatment Plant superintendent, said they discovered the leak some time June 25, but aren't exactly sure when the leak started that day.

"We figure that we got somewhere in the neighborhood of a couple hundred thousand gallons of raw river water mixed into approximately one million gallons of clean, treated water," he said. "By the time we caught it, that water went out into the system already."

He said putting the system out of service to clean it out just wasn't an option.

"Our plan is to monitor the water by using a tracer and by measuring the suspended sediment maintained in water by turbulent flow," said the superintendent. "Basically what we're going to do is follow the 'slug' of water, and once we're comfortable that the turbidities [measure of sediment] in other towns are mirroring what we are currently producing at the plant, we'll be comfortable in saying

the facilities are flushed."

Mr. Sorenson said the plant will conduct a water quality test to ensure the samples pass acceptable standards. As to when water will be suitable to consume, Mr. Sorenson is unsure of the exact date.

"Right now everyone wants to know how long this will take, and while we don't know exactly how long, we're doing everything we can to provide good water to the communities," he said. "We're going to do whatever is necessary to resolve this situation."

Larry Thelen, North Dakota Department of Health drinking water program administrator, said they had been working with the plant since June 24 on other issues, and then the water incident occurred.

"The people here at the plant have been doing a great job trying to control what has happened," said Mr. Thelen. "We're going to do some checking before we say the water is fine. The boil order will stay until we work through things. It's going to be quite a process."

Mr. Thelen referenced Grand Forks, N.D., as having a similar situation; it is that situation they are using as a guide to get through this one.

"Grand Forks has been through something similar in 1997, so we'll pretty much follow the same process, but for now we just have to make sure we get all the details laid out and determine how everything is going to happen," he said.

Capt. Samuel Logan, 5th Civil Engineer Squadron interim operations flight com-

mander, met with the water treatment plant officials to discuss water conditions, precautions that needed to be taken, and to also offer assistance as needed.

"We are not only here as a stakeholder, we're here to support," said the captain. "We have our own plumbers and water engineers on base, so if manpower assistance is needed, we can help."

During the June 26 press conference in downtown Minot, many audience members expressed concerns and questions about the consumption

and use of tap water.

Officials advise people using tap water within Ward County to continue using water to wash hands, but to do so for at least 20 seconds using antibacterial soap, and to dry hands thoroughly. Using hand sanitizer following hand washing is recommended.

Using the water to do laundry is also acceptable. If possible, it is advised to do so in hot water. For young children and infants, health officials advise using boiled or bottled water for bathing, hand-washing clothes,

and preparing formula and food. Using the dishwasher is also said to be safe, but it is recommended that dishes be sanitized with any one of the sanitation solutions suggested on First District of Health's website.

If contaminated water is ingested, health officials assure the public that no real harm would be done to the individual. People with weakened immune systems are most vulnerable and should be extra cautious.

Exercise trains for real-world emergency

JOINT BASE BALAD, Iraq - Airmen from the 332nd Air Expeditionary Wing Safety Office, 332nd Expeditionary Maintenance Squadron and 332nd Civil Engineer Squadron Fire Department worked together to accomplish a confined space exercise.

The exercise was conducted June 18 on the flightline at Joint Base Balad.

"We held this exercise to get hands-on experience in

case a real-life emergency happens," said Tech. Sgt. Christopher Smith, 332nd AEW Safety Office program NCO in charge, who is deployed from Minot Air Force Base, N.D. "They have a plan, but now they have an idea of how to initiate it and recover personnel."

The scenario for the exercise involved two maintainers who had become unconscious while fixing an F-16 fuel gadget.

"The F-16 has very tight quarters and is a hazardous environment for fumes," explained Staff Sgt. Brett Schofield, 332nd CES Fire

Department firefighter, who is deployed from Travis AFB, Calif.

Sergeant Schofield is a native of Midland, S.D.

In addition to hazardous vapors or gasses, in a real-world situation, another incident that could have happened in a fuel gadget is the oxygen level could have decreased.

Once another maintainer found the two Airmen unconscious and could not get them out, the Fire Department was called and they responded. They pulled the Airmen from the simulated fuel gadget and started initial medical treatment. "Both the firefighters and maintainers did fairly well, I'd give them a passing grade," said Sergeant Smith, who is a native of Jackson, Miss.

To further prevent this type of scenario, maintainers usually have a monitor that watches the fume levels and they wear respirators.





State Historical Society makes \$55,000 available for restoration, preservation

The State Historical Society of North Dakota (SHSND), through its annual appropriation of Historic Preservation Fund (HPF) money from the National Park Service, is making \$55,000 available to the public for use in the restoration, stabilization, and protection of historic and archaeological properties.

This money can only be used on properties listed in the National Register of Historic Places. North Dakota's funding priority for the 2011 fiscal year is publicly-owned buildings. The granting of HPF money is competitive process.

Applications will be reviewed by a committee from the SHSND's Archaeology and Historic Preservation Division and rated based on four major categories: quality of the application, need for the development work, impact on the historic preservation program, and the project's compliance with the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for the Treatment

of Historic Properties.

Eligible activities include pre-development work (plans, evaluations, engineering and architectural or archaeological services), restoration, rehabilitation, and preservation projects and must meet the Secretary of the Interior's Standards Routine maintenance and work on properties owned by religious organizations or used for religious purposes are not eligible for funding. Pre-development work on religious properties may be eligible. All applications must be received by the SHSND by Friday, July 29.



Officials stop moves to Minot Air Force Base

RANDOLPH AIR FORCE BASE, Texas - Air Force officials have temporarily halted most permanent change of station moves and temporary duty assignments to Minot Air Force Base, N.D.

Flooding has forced many to evacuate the city of Minot, N.D., prompting the commanders of the 5th Bomb Wing and 91st Missile Wing to request a partial stop movement, said Col. David Slade, the Airman assignments director for the Air Force Personnel Center.

Some Airmen will proceed as ordered because mission needs require their support, he said.

"Those Airmen have been identified in a specific list to the force support squadrons and the military personnel

sections in the field, so those units will help inform Airmen who are authorized to continue to Minot," Colonel Slade added.

Airmen within the U.S.

who are projected to move to Minot AFB, and those who have already out-processed but who have not departed their current duty station - except those specifically authorized to continue their move - must not leave, he said. Air Force civilians with orders to Minot AFB should not leave their losing base until further notice.

Airmen planning to take leave en route may depart their station, but cannot report to Minot AFB afterward if the stop movement is still in place, he said. In that

event, they will be charged leave for the additional time.

The colonel said Airmen stationed overseas with June or July return dates and orders for Minot AFB who have

charged against their leave account.

• Those who do not plan to take leave en route must remain at their overseas station until the stop movement order is lifted.

• Those inter-ested in voluntarily extending the overseas time may submit an extension request for consideration.

Military members who have already departed their permanent duty station will be contacted by the personnel section, Colonel Slade said. Those en route to Minot AFB who did not plan to take leave will be required to report to the nearest Air Force base military personnel flight, where they will be placed on temporary duty hold.

Airmen and Air Force civilians with temporary duty orders to Minot AFB must get gaining unit approval to proceed before leaving their duty station, he said. Airmen whose temporary duty assignments are not approved must remain in place until further notice.

All Minot AFB Airmen scheduled to return home from temporary duty or leave may do so.

For more information about the stop movement order, affected Airmen should contact their current or most recent permanent duty station MPF, or call the AFPC assignment programs and procedures branch at 210-565-3815, or the 24-hour contact at 210-565-2020.

YOKOTA AIR BASE, Japan (AFNS) - Independence Day is a major holiday in the United States and overseas at American facilities. This year, Air Force leaders urge members and their families to practice safe use of fireworks in an effort to prevent any mishaps.

According to an American Pyrotechnics Association fact sheet, consumption of fireworks in the United States has risen dramatically from 29 million pounds to more than 265.5 million pounds over the past three decades.

While the use of fireworks has increased by almost 920%, injuries per 100,000 pounds of fireworks have decreased more than 90%.

Officials with the National Council on Fireworks Safety urge consumers to be fireworks smart, before, during and after their consumer fireworks display.

Before: Choose an open area away from spectators, homes and buildings and dry vegetation. Use a garden hose to wet down the area before firing.

During: As each device burns out, soak it using a hose, or bucket of water.

After: Place all used items in a covered, fireproof container and leave it outside and away from homes and buildings.

Treat all fireworks with respect, read all the cautions

AF to enhance travel orders for deployment

WASHINGTON (AFNS) - In an effort to improve customer support and expedite travel voucher payments, Air Force financial management leaders will mandate standardized use of the Defense Travel System for contingency, exercise and deployment travel, officials said here June 28.

The change will be mostly transparent to the traveler, who will still receive a paper CED order from the personnel readiness unit; however, these orders will now be stamped "Certified in DTS," reminding the traveler and the local financial services office to file the settlement voucher in DTS, officials added.

"The FSO will continue to support the traveler throughout the entire process," said Chief Master Sgt. Jesse Stirling, financial management's enlisted career field manager.

Finance management officials said this translates to significant reductions in voucher turnaround time; DTS payments average three days, whereas filing

a paper voucher averages 8 days.

"Standardized CED travel operations will provide a consistent practice for all Airmen without regard to deployed location or primary duty station," said Joan Causey, the deputy assistant secretary for financial operations. "Expanding DTS procedures for CED travel to all locations will bring long-range benefits such as increased transparency and timelier travel payments to Airmen."

Chief Stirling said the new process will positively impact Airmen in exercises or downrange, allowing them to focus more on the mission and less on getting mired in the administrative side of filing travel claims.

"For example, scheduled partial payments (or accruals) for the duration of the trip will become automatic after the initial payment is loaded into DTS," Chief Stirling said. "This new procedure will standardize voucher computation across the Air Force and streamline the filing process for the customer."

The program is slated for Air Force-wide use June 30. For more information, contact the base financial services office.




